SY22 Early College Overview

The purpose of this memorandum is to provide a brief overview of Early College enrollment in MMSD during SY22, including efforts to support recruitment and success based on a Board member's inquiry. Additional data and information will be shared in a future weekly update

There are four programs' that collectively make up Early College.

- 1) Start College Now (SCN) coursework occurring at Madison College (or other Wisconsin Technical colleges) with Madison College professors
- 2) **Early College Credit Program (ECCP)** coursework occurring at UW-Madison (or other Wisconsin 4-year universities) taught by UW-Madison professors
- 3) **Dual Credit** College-credit bearing coursework taught in MMSD high schools by MMSD teachers who qualify as adjunct professors by Madison College
- **4)** Early College STEM Academy Cohorts of students who take all high school coursework through Madison College with a particular focus on expanded access to STEM content.

This week's update: **East High School**

We are committed to keeping you informed as we complete construction from the MMSD 2020 facilities referendum.

Preparing for students and staff

Various construction phases have seen immense progress over the past month in anticipation of students and staff returning for the fall semester.

Inside the school, numerous interior finish elements such as science lab casework, painting, ceilings, floor finishes, and ceramic tiling have been installed in the first of many academic renovation phases. Students and staff will be welcomed back to the freshly renovated classrooms on the third floor.

On the exterior, crews continue to pour concrete foundations, set structural steel, and construct new masonry walls to enclose the new cafeteria, music area, and multipurpose room additions.

Ongoing construction activities

- Renovating the first phase of English classrooms on the second floor
- Starting the first phase of lower-level locker room renovations
- Building the structural elements for the new cafeteria, music area, and multipurpose room additions
- Continuing with masonry restoration work on the interior sides of the building façade



New epoxy lab countertops, casework, flooring, ceilings, and paint are installed in the renovated science lab rooms on the third floor



Work will continue during the upcoming school year for the structural steel roof on the new multipurpose room addition





PARTICIPANT DEMOGRAPHICS


School-Based Programs* (SREC & YRC)

Adult & All Age Community Programs



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




SUCCESSES & CHALLENGES

Successes

- ✓ Interest and demand for programs matched pre-pandemic levels in 2022.
- ✓ Increased presence in the community with coordination of Mobile Madison collaboration and MSCR participation in City of Madison Parks Alive events coordinated by the Neighborhood Resource Teams in 8 underserved neighborhoods.
- √ 93% of customers surveyed reported being happy or extremely happy with the quality of their MSCR program.

Challenges

- ✓ Staffing remains a challenge with the number of seasonal staff not keeping pace with demand for programs, and many young, inexperienced staff working in youth programs.
- Facilities limitations due to construction and improvement projects.
- ✓ Limited transportation for field trips and partnership opportunities.
- ✓ Lack of participant diversity in community programs. MSCR participants mirror City of Madison demographics, but not the MMSD population.

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
