On average, violins rent for \$15-20, violas \$20-25, cellos \$35-50 and basses \$50+ per month. All instruments are available for rent to own or purchase. *Please don't purchase an internet instrument unless you have talked to Mr. Kemp first!* Some of the instruments available for purchase on the internet may look good but the quality is poor. Many times students who try playing these instruments fail in orchestra because the instruments fail the student. There are a couple of cellos and basses available through the district for student use at your school which are available at no cost.
