

2018 Seniors of Jasper High School

#### JHS—Proud Of Our Seniors!

Congratulations to the Senior Class of 2018! We are proud of this class and what they have been able to accomplish in their time at Jasper High School.

- ⇒ Total # of graduates including mid-year graduates in December is 182 (11 in December)
- $\Rightarrow$  68% have stated they plan to enter and graduate from a 4-year college
- ⇒ After graduating—30 plan to enter a 2-year program, 16 plan to work immediately after graduation & 11 plan to enlist in the military
- ⇒ 29 students graduated with a 4.0 GPA or above
- ⇒ 92 received an academic scholarship (58%)
- ⇒ 10 received an athletic scholarship
- ⇒ Total Scholarships funded accounted for \$3,122,946
- ⇒ One student scored a perfect 36 on his ACT
- ⇒ Two students were given the Eagle Scout Distinction
- ⇒ 91% of graduates received at least one indicator stating they are college/career ready
- ⇒ 45 received the President's Award with a 3.5 GPS and at least a 25 on the ACT


### Jonathan Allen Named JHS Principal

"Ironically, it was almost 20 years ago since I graduated from Walker High School. It is my honor and privilege to now serve our system as principal of Jasper High School."

Allen has been principal of T.R. Simmons Elementary since 2014. He is a graduate of Birmingham-Southern College, where he earned a bachelor's degree in science. He earned his teaching credentials from the University of Alabama and received his administrator certificate from Samford University.

He taught 10 years at Minor High School and became assistant principal there before becoming principal at T.R. Simmons. "It's been my honor to serve our teachers at T.R. Simmons, and the biggest thing that I can say about my life experience is that every step of the way, God has put someone in my life to help me to the next step," Allen said. "The greatest thing I can do for our students is to be that for them, be that for our teachers, so we all grow together and we all connect with one another to be more effective in impacting students and their learning."

#### **Viking Athletics**

Jasper High School's 539 student athletes made headlines in the 2017-18 school year. The volleyball team was the 6A state runners up, and several members of the All-State volleyball team were recognized for their accomplishments. Five members of the high school's wrestling team qualified as outside participants in the State Wrestling Championships, and the men's tennis team was named 6A state tennis champions. The women's tennis team finished fifth in the 6A championship. Jasper High golf team member Patrick Minor played in the State Golf Championships as an individual qualifier. Zac Durham (baseball) and Morgan McClendon (volleyball) were Alabama High School North/South All-Star Game Selections, and Bob White was named the Alabama Athletic Trainers Association Athletic Trainer of the Year.

Before joining Jasper Junior High, she was the secondary instructional partner for the city schools, working with middle school and high school teachers on literacy design. She has also made literacy presentations at several state and national conferences. Fields also taught first-grade for 12 years.

Dr. Jackson commented, "T.R. Simmons is a great school with a lot of wonderful practices

in place and wonderful teachers that are student centered. Mrs. Fields will continue to foster a warm, welcoming learning environment in which children excel."

We appreciate the hard work of our students and teachers on the recent State Assessments. In Math, 93% of all our 4<sup>th</sup> graders showed growth or improvement, 93% of 5<sup>th</sup> graders showed growth or improvement, and 99% of 6<sup>th</sup> graders showed growth or improvement. In Reading, 83% of all our 4<sup>th</sup> graders showed growth or improvement, 82% of 5<sup>th</sup> graders showed growth or improvement, and 81% of 6<sup>th</sup> graders showed growth or improvement. This was a great accomplishment and we look forward to exceeding these scores next year. #goodtogreat



#### Park School Erupting With High Student Achievement!

MPS ended the year in style!!!! Following our state testing, MPS students were able to experience a variety of activities that kept them engaged. On April 27, MPS had the pleasure of hosting James Spann from ABC 33/40. Mr. Spann spoke with our students about the different weather events that occur in our area and around Alabama. In May, the Walker County Soil and Water Conservation along with Alabama Power, were able to set up an outdoor exhibit for our second grade students. This gave our students the opportunity to experience and hear about many of the natural resources in our area.

Along with these activities, MPS hosted two of our annual events in the month of May. First was our annual second grade butterfly release. Second grade students were able to study the life cycle of a butterfly and raise their own. After spending several weeks in the classroom with their butterflies, students were able to set them free with the help of their friends and family. A second MPS event was the annual third grade volcano eruption. Third grade students were able to study these land forms and the effects they can have on the environment. After building a model and reporting to their classmates, students were able to erupt their own volcano with the help of their family members.

#### T.R. Simmons Students Accomplished A LOT This Year!

Below are a few statistical achievements the T.R. Simmons students and faculty would like to share. We invite parents to view all of our end of the year data posted on our school Facebook page.

- The 1<sup>st</sup> grade BOY math assessment average was 39% but we grew to 91% by the end of the year. For the same assessment type, kindergarten grew from 56% to 94%.
- Our 1<sup>st</sup> grade STAR score improved from kindergarten seventh month at the start of the year to second grade sixth month by the end of the year. That's an improvement in our grade level average of just under two years' worth of growth in one year.
- Due to our 1<sup>st</sup> graders participating in the accelerated reader program throughout the year, we saw dramatic impact in student scores. Specifically in DIBELS, we saw Whole Words Read improve from 60% benchmark at the start of the school year to 95% benchmark by years' end.
- We are also proud of the accomplishments of our kindergarten English Learners where we had 23 of 30 students meet the DIBELS composite benchmark by the end of the year.

A special thanks to the community stakeholders for supporting our 6<sup>th</sup> Annual Simmons at Sunset, presented this year by Carl Cannon. Due to the efforts of many and the running feet of our Little Vikes, we raised over \$15,000 in profit for our school. The best part of this great event is that we connected with our community in a very special way. Thank you to all of the great sponsors and supporters of our school.

#### Jasper Junior High School

WE are so PROUD of our Jasper Junior High School students! Congratulations to all deserving students on receiving recognition for your efforts on awards day! We'd also like to recognize our teachers and students who participate in choir and band for putting on an amazing performance!!! We have a strong fine arts department and it really shows!

Snap! That's how quickly the school year has seemed to pass! It's amazing to see how much our students have grown over the course of a school year. We have many great things occurring within our school system, and we're seeking to get better and better! Our school leadership team is constantly thinking of ways to improve instruction and make great memories for our students. One of many changes involves a shift to our culture and climate with our very own House System. The idea of the House System comes from a recent visit by system teachers and administrators to the Ron Clark Academy in Atlanta, Georgia. Every student will join a house (faction) within the school. Each house will be able to receive points based on displays leadership, scholarship, and citizenship. During periods throughout the year, students will be rewarded based on the number of points accumulated at the time. Because of the house system, we are expecting to witness decreases in truancy, tardies, and also discipline; furthermore, we're expecting to witness increases academic achievement and growth.
