Brain and Body Connection

- Rapid, but uneven, physical growth
- Physical maturation means = Increase in activity and new interests
- Social Emotional development lags behind physical growth
- What were you thinking?
 - Capable of abstract thinking and self-reflection, BUT...
 - The portion of the brain that governs decision making and controls impulsive is still developing
- Every behavior has consequences positive or negative
 - Emphasis on the learning experience

Brain and Body Connection

• During adolescence, the parts of the brain that are responsible for expressing emotions and for seeking gratification tend to mature sooner that the regions of the brain that control impulses and that oversees careful decision making. As one expert puts it, the teenage brain "has a well-developed accelerator but only a partly developed brake." www.mentorfoundation.org/brain

 - Music Lessons





Need to Know...
