SPANISH 2

Communication is more important than accuracy

Students are presented with the basics of the language and facts about different Spanish speaking cultures around the world.





INSTRUCTION INCLUDES GAMES, MINI-LESSONS, READ ALOUDS AND SONGS. EACH UNIT OF STUDY CULMINATES IN A PROJECT THAT WILL BE SHARED ON SEESAW.

In Unit 1, we will read 'Como un puñado de botones' and learn about different types of families. Our students will learn to talk about their loved ones integrating grammar concepts like the adjective and noun agreement.

Later in the term, during Unit 2, we will learn about other schools around the world and make a presentation about ASL using simple language structures to express opinion and preference.

In Unit 3 in the second term, we will read 'Rana de tres ojos', a book about the impact of human activity on natural habitats. Integrating with the science curriculum, we will make a presentation describing animals and habitats in Spanish.

HOW DO SECOND GRADERS LEARN?

Grade 2 students are good at repeating words and high frequency phrases, reacting to verbal cues and responding with highly rehearsed language. We do not ask them, for example: 'How do you say this in



Spanish?' Instead, we ask open questions and let them answer with a rehearsed word/sentence. E.g.: ¿Cuál es tu animal favorito? ¡El caballo!

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How often do students have Spanish in Grade 2? Students have 3 sessions of 30 minutes every cycle (90 min a cycle).

How does the program attend different proficiency levels? Whether a student has not received Spanish instruction before or is a heritage speaker, teachers will provide with extra help and resources to meet their individual needs.

How can we support the learning at home? Check out Seesaw for monthly updates, ask your kids about what they are learning, try some of the games we play in the classroom, read to your kids in Spanish and watch/listen to age appropriate shows, movies and songs.
