
SPANISH 4

REPORTED STANDARDS

LISTENING

INSTRUCTION INCLUDES GAMES, MINI-LESSONS, READ ALOUDS AND SONGS.

In Unit 1 we will read '¿De dónde eres?', a book about belonging set in Argentina. We will reflect on the things that we value and write a poem in Spanish about them. Sharing our poems will be a way to get to know each other better and create the kind of community we want our class to be.

Later in the term, during Unit 2, we will honor the important people in our lives by describing them in Spanish. We will learn about basic verb conjugation and how to string original sentences.

HOW DO FOURTH GRADES LEARN?

Grade 4 students are good at using highly rehearsed language. They can also lead games and activities and work independently on their assignments. They are encouraged to learn both key words and the words that speak to their preferences and choices and are introduced to very simple grammar concepts such as gender and



number agreement and basic verb conjugation. They can read simple words and familiar sentences.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How often do students have Spanish in Grade 4? Students have 3 sessions of 35 minutes every cycle (105 min a cycle).

How does the program attend different proficiency levels? Whether a student has not received Spanish instruction before or is a heritage speaker, teachers will provide with extra help and resources to meet their individual needs.

How can we support the learning at home? Check out Seesaw for monthly updates, ask your kids about what they are learning, try some of the games we play in the classroom, read to your kids in Spanish and watch/listen to age appropriate shows, movies and songs.
