## Federal COVID-19 Relief Spending

Across Indiana, \$2.8 billion in federal funding has been allocated to local school districts to help address schools' COVID-19 related needs.

Here at Tippecanoe School Corporation, we have been allocated \$17,590,628.01 from three rounds of Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) funding – which is based on the district's share of the state's Title I allocation – and federal Governor's Emergency Education Relief (GEER) funds.

Over the last two years, we developed plans for how to strategically and sustainably deploy these funds to successfully support our school leaders, educators, and support staff; accelerate student learning; make a sustainable impact on innovation across our schools; and update technology and other infrastructure within our school facilities.

Through our locally-developed plans, we are investing in –

- Technology for student usage
- Assessment tools to accelerate student learning
- Safety/Security upgrades to our facilities
- COVID Related supplies and materials
- Staff recruitment/retention hiring incentives
- Air Quality/HVAC Improvements to our facilities

Even though, many of the planned items have been completed, not all spending has been completed as of the date of this report. Per federal law, we have through September 2022 to encumber the first round of ESSER funding (ESSER I/CARES Act) and through September 2023 and September 2024, respectively, to encumber the second and third rounds (ESSER II/ESSER III) of the ESSER grants.
