LUNCH WAVES

Advisory meets every Wednesday from 8:55-9:15.

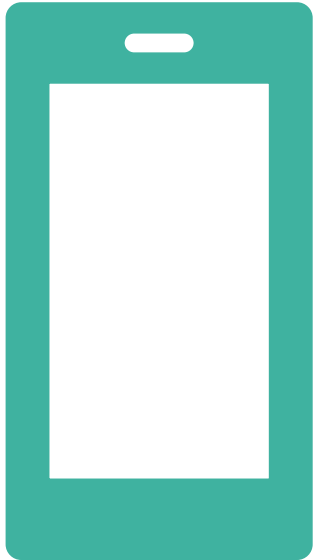
Advisory enables faculty and students to establish relationships outside of the classroom environment and opportunities to discuss personal, academic, and career goals.



ACCESS TO THE LIBRARY

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- Students assigned to freshman or structured study hall must submit a completed pass to access the library to their study hall teacher

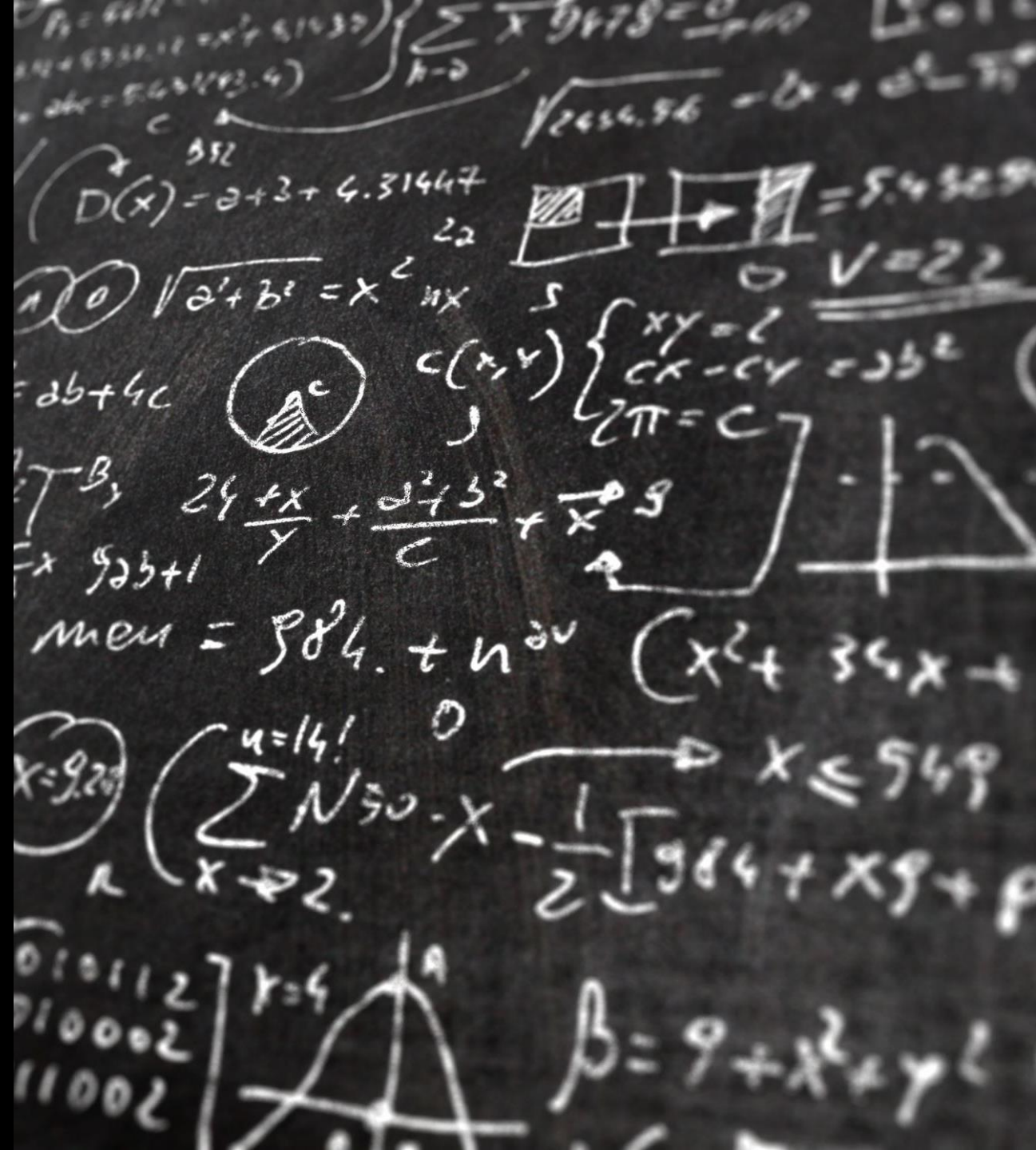
