

LUNCH WAVES

- Students are expected to remain in the Commons for the entirety of their assigned lunch wave
- Lunch will occur in two waves during Block A₃ and B₃ classes:
 - Wave #1 10:50-11:20

Advisory meets every Wednesday from 8:55-9:15.


Advisory enables faculty and students to establish relationships outside of the classroom environment and opportunities to discuss personal, academic, and career goals.



ACCESS TO THE LIBRARY

- Students assigned to freshman or structured study hall must submit a <u>completed pass</u> to access the library to their study hall teacher
- Students assigned to flexible study hall must sign out with their study hall teacher to access the library
- All students must sign-in to access the library and respect the rules:
 - Pursue individual studies and course-related work
 - Be respectful of others and use technology appropriately
 - Besides water, no food or drink is allowed
- Failure to respect the rules of the library will result in the loss of library privileges

CELL PHONES, SMARTWATCHES AND AIRPODS


