



GRADE WEIGHTING & GPA CALCULATION

Each Honors (H) and Advanced Placement (AP) course receives +1 pt. in GPA calculation. All GPAs include only final grades.

HONORS (H) & ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) COURSES

Honors (H) and Advanced Placement (AP) courses are equivalent. Honors (H) courses are offered in the years preceding or following an AP course, or in place of an AP course not in our curriculum. Honors (H) and Advanced Placement (AP) courses extend well beyond exam prep and challenge students to understand, create and express knowledge in multiple ways. Students are encouraged to limit the number they take.

STANDARD COURSE LOAD

The academic year is divided into two semesters. Full-year courses carry 1 credit and semester courses carry .5 credits. A standard academic load is 5.5 credits per year.


