The School and Community

The Bishop's School in La Jolla, California is an independent, coeducational college-preparatory day school for 800 students in grades six through 12, drawing from over 50 zip codes and 157 middle and high schools. Founded in 1909, the School is affiliated with the Episcopal Church. Many of our students commute more than an hour each way. Of the 102 teaching faculty members, 87 have advanced degrees, and the student-teacher ratio is 9 to 1. Last year, Bishop's distributed approximately \$4.2 million in financial aid to approximately 20 percent of the student body. Students of color make up more than 51 percent of the student population. There are 131 students in the Class of 2023.

Student Life

The Bishop's School encourages development in all aspects of a student's life.

Bishop's **athletics** program is designed to be broad enough to prepare gifted athletes to compete at the college level while also ensuring that all students are exposed to the lifelong benefits of athletics and physical fitness. During the course of a school year, over 80 percent of Bishop's Upper School students play on one or more of the 40 varsity and junior varsity teams.

The School also has award-winning **performing arts** groups. Acting Workshop, Advanced Theater Production, Bishop's Singers, Performing Dance Group and Studio Dance Group are highly selective, audition-only ensembles that represent the School's greatest performing arts talents and require significant time commitment outside of the classroom.

In addition to the arts, **academic teams and programs** such as Academic League, Associated Student Body Council (ASBC), Journalism, Mock Trial, Model United Nations, Peer Support, Robotics, Speech and Debate and Yearbook require substantial commitment on the part of the involved students.

There are a variety of **student-led clubs** on campus. Some focus on helping others, such as Period Poverty Project and Lucky Ducklings, while others focus on shared interests, such as Spikeball Club and Gardening Club. **Affinity spaces** cultivate a sense of belonging for people of a shared identity through discussion and cultural celebration.

Community service emphasizes mindful reflection and relationship building and is customized by each student based on their personal passion. As part of the program, students work regularly with a service organization of their choosing. Throughout this experience, students reflect and answer questions on a blog before sharing their personal service journey with peer groups. Students must complete at least 20 hours of service each year, and each graduating class has traditionally completed a total of roughly 30,000+ service hours by the time they complete their Bishop's career.

Academic Offerings

Honors courses are in place of the AP curriculum. As of 2021-22, Bishop's no longer offers AP courses and places no expectation on students to take AP exams. Bishop's does administer the exams to accommodate students who may wish to take one or more tests by their own choice.

Advanced Honors courses encourage intensive study in a seminar setting beyond the bounds of Honors courses in an effort to allow students to pursue special and advanced interests in particular fields of study.

Global Online Academy (GOA) is a not-for-profit consortium of leading independent schools around the world dedicated to developing 21st century skills while preserving the academic excellence that is the hallmark of its member schools. The Bishop's School is a member of Global Online Academy and offers limited enrollment in its classes. GOA's course offerings enhance opportunities to learn and explore topics not covered or conveniently scheduled in the program on campus.

Independent study (IS) courses allow students to explore their passions with faculty sponsors; they must be supported by faculty and approved by department heads. Past IS examples include Quantum Mechanics, the Art of Directing, Cellular Biology of Female Reproduction, and Survey of South American History Through Literature. Independent study courses receive a letter grade and are included in the GPA calculation.

Grade Point Average and Standardized Testing

The Bishop's School calculates a GPA but encourages students to "think beyond the GPA." We know that the GPA can be an oversimplification of the student's academic record and does not tell the whole story of their academic journey.

The GPA is calculated using all letter grades from Grade 9 and higher on the Bishop's transcript, with the exception of Health and Global Online Academy Courses. Non-Bishop's courses are also not included in the GPA.

Letter grades are assigned a numerical value on the 4.00 scale (A = 4.00, A- = 3.67, B+ = 3.33, etc.). Weighted GPAs are calculated by adding an additional 1.00 to the letter grade for any course with an "Honors" or "Advanced Honors" designation (A = 5.00, A- = 4.67, etc.).

The Bishop's School does not calculate class rank.

COVID-19 Impact for Class of 2023

The Class of 2023 experienced school in a fully remote setting (March-May 2020 in Grade 9), shifted to in-person learning on a rotating schedule (August 2020-March 2021 in Grade 10), and resumed their regular in-person schedule (April 2021 at the end of Grade 10 to now). Bishop's maintained its letter grading policy throughout this time.
