

MEDICATION AT SCHOOL

Students are NOT allowed to have medication at school, this includes non-prescription medication like Advil, Tylenol, etc. All medication must be cleared through the Emerson Office, contact Sally Jenkins, our Health Room Office Professional.

Parents/guardians are responsible for:

- ♦ Supplying all medications/transporting medication to and from school.
- Completing required <u>medication authorization forms</u>. An <u>authorization to administer medication form</u> must be turned in for each medication whether prescription or non-prescription. The form must be signed by the health care provider and parent and/or guardian. Medication cannot be given without the completed form.
- ♦ All prescribed medication must be in the original, labeled prescription bottle, container or package.
- All non-prescription medication must be in original container and labeled by the parent, <u>including</u>: Student Name, Medication Name, Dosage, Date Issued, Name of Health Care Provider, and Time medication is to be given.

Scheduled medications are given between 11:00 AM - 1:00 PM only.

REGISTRATION PACKETS

Registration packets will be handed out to your students the first week of school. We need to have current information each year including current residency address, parent emails, emergency contact information, etc.

If you have not seen and/or signed the required forms in the packet, please ask your student or call us to obtain another packet. Please return the required forms from the packet as soon as possible so your student's record will be up to date.

Your student is NOT considered registered at EMHS until this registration packet is returned complete.

ATTENDANCE LINE

Remember, students <u>and</u> parents/guardians are responsible for school attendance. The parent or legal guardian of any student living with them, even if over 18 years old, who is absent from class is requested to leave a phone message on the **Emerson Attendance Line at 425-936-2306** *within 48 hours of* the absence to explain the circumstances of an absence.

Please call or email (Mary at mosness@lwsd.org or Sally at sjenkins@lwsd.org) to notify the school <u>in advance</u> of pre-planned absences. For vacation or extended absences, the student must pick up a form in the office for teachers and parent to sign <u>prior to the absence</u>.

If your student was absent from any classes during a particular day, you will receive an automated attendance call after 6:45 PM on that day. If that absence needs to be excused, please call and leave a message on the EMHS attendance line, via email to the Office Manager at mosness@lwsd.org, or supply a parent or physician note.

OCTOBER PSAT & SAT TESTING

2022 PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) for Sophomores and Juniors

Date: Wed., October 12, 2022

The cost for the PSAT/NMSQT test for <u>Sophomores</u> is covered by the District. All 10th graders take the PSAT.

Juniors can choose to take the PSAT/NMSQT, cost is \$18.

2022 SAT for Seniors

<u>Seniors</u> can choose to take the SAT. Participating students from EMHS will test at Lake Washington High School. Cost \$60 or if on Free/Reduced Lunch status \$8.

Checks, written to EMHS, are due prior to October 11 to Mary in the main office.

PARENT ACCESS

The LWSD provides access to student information including student records, lunch accounts, and more via the Internet. This information is secure so that only you can see information about your student (s). The system through which you can view this information is called **Parent Access**.

WORLD COMPETENCY TESTING

LWSD World Language Biliteracy Testing for the Seal of Biliteracy is available to all 9th-12th grade students living within the district boundaries. ORCA CARDS - New process for 2022-23!

The LWSD is no longer involved with issuing Orca Cards. Metro will be implementing Free Youth Transit cards in a phased approach, beginning the 2022-23 school year.

Youth, ages 18 and younger can ride transit for free starting September 1st throughout King, Snohomish, Pierce, and Kitsap counties. Participating transit agencies are Community Transit, Everett Transit, King Country Metro, Kitsap Transit, Pierce Transit, Sound Transit, City of Seattle, Seattle Streetcar, and Washington State Ferries (starting October 1st).

Students with existing LWSD Orca cards will keep them and will need to get a sticker from the office as part of the registration process. This sticker can be affixed to the back of the card. The sticker will instruct students to register their card with Free-

YouthTransitPass.com. Students will have until June 30, 2023 to complete registrations.

Students who need/want a new Orca card will be able to pick up a new black Orca card in the main office and will need to register their card as well with FreeYouthTransitPass.com. Students will have until June 30, 2023 to complete registrations.

SCHOOL MEALS FOR THE 2022-23 SCHOOL YEAR

Since the beginning of the pandemic, the USDA has funded free meals to all students, The USDA free meal waiver expired on June 30, 2022. As a result, the district will start charging fees again for lunch and breakfast starting in the 2022-23 school year.

Free and Reduced Meal Applications:

The District strongly encourage all families who might be eligible for benefits to submit an application as soon as possible. Emerson has put an application in the registration packets. You may also complete an application online through MySchoolApps-Home Page which takes less than 10 minutes, and parents only need to complete one application per family. Additional Benefits for Free and Reduced:

Students that are eligible for Free and Reduced meals are also eligible to receive fee waivers for athletics, extracurricular activities and other programs. In order for the district to waive these fees, you must provide consent to share your Free and Reduced eligibility status for this purpose. You can provide consent on the Free and Reduced application. If you are already qualified for free and reduced meals or you are directly certified through the State, you can provide your consent to share eligibility information in Family Access by following these instructions|instrucciones. School breakfast and lunch will be served at NO COST to those children who qualify for free or reduced-price meals. All other students will be charged \$2.50 for breakfast and \$4.00 for lunch.



DISTRICT TIP LINE

Safety is one of our district's top priorities and to help safeguard our school community, we've taken an important step that we want to share with you. Our district is now using *Vector Alert*, a tip reporting service that allows students, staff and parents to submit safety concerns to our District administrators five different ways:

1. App: Search for "Vector Alert" in the App Store to download for free

If an administrator is not nearby or available to take your tip, you and your child can easily report tips on bullying, harassment, drugs, vandalism, threats of violence or any safety issue you're concerned about through Vector Alert. When you submit a tip, be sure to use our district's identification code: 1342 in your communication.

Every tip Vector Alert receives about our district is immediately logged in the system and our administration is notified so that they can investigate and take appropriate action. And, tips may also be submitted anonymously if you prefer.

Together, using Vector Alert, we can make our district a safer place to work and learn! Thanks in advance for your support.

TOO SICK FOR SCHOOL

One of the best ways to avoid community transmission of COVID-19, and other infectious illness, is to stay home when you are sick. Students and school employees who have symptoms of infectious illness, such as influenzas (flu) or COVID-19 should stay home and seek medical evaluation, which may include testing for COVID-19 and other respiratory infections.

While the school will no longer require an attestation form at the start of each day, we ask families to please answer the following questions at home before deciding to send your child to school. If you answer "YES" to any of the following questions, keep your student home and contact your school.

- Has your student been in close contact with anyone with confirmed COVID-19?
- 2. Does anyone in your household have COVID-19 like symptoms &/or is anyone in your household being tested for COVID-19?
- 3. Has your student or anyone in your household had a positive COVID-19 test for active virus in the past 10 days?
- 4. Within the past 14 days, has a public health or medical professional told your student to self-monitor, self-isolate or self-quarantine because of concerns about COVID-19?
