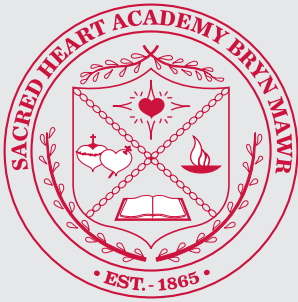

## SCHEDULE AND COVID IMPACT

Sacred Heart Academy operates on a rotating schedule with five classes meeting each day, allowing for more focused time in longer class periods. Students are required to take six courses, and limited to seven courses per semester.

On March 15, 2020, SHA transitioned to a virtual academic learning platform due to campus closure as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. Faculty and students maintained academic rigor and integrity throughout virtual learning until the end of the academic year. For the 2020-2021 academic year, Sacred Heart Academy resumed full-time, in-person classes, while also offering virtual attendance per student need. For the 2021-2022 academic year Sacred Heart Academy maintained full-time in-person learning and adhered to the curriculum.

## GPA/COURSE WEIGHT/RANK POLICY

The school year is divided into two semesters. A cumulative GPA is calculated at the end of every academic year. Final grades calculated in a student's GPA include Sacred Heart Academy and SophieConnect courses exclusively.

Advanced Placement and Diocesan Scholar courses are weighted with 0.5 increase in GPA. Honors courses are weighted with 0.25 increase in GPA.

Sacred Heart Academy does not rank. Sacred Heart schools commit to educating the whole child in accordance with the Sacred Heart *Goals and Criteria*.

## ADVANCED PLACEMENT AND HONORS COURSES FOR 2022-2023

Students are admitted to Honors and AP courses through application and teacher approval. The total number of Honors and AP courses taken by a student may be restricted due to scheduling constraints. Sacred Heart Academy limits sophomores to one AP class, juniors to two AP classes, and seniors to three AP classes during their respective academic year.

## SOPHIECONNECT

This unique collaborative program offers demanding online courses to all students of the Sacred Heart Network. Courses are taught by Sacred Heart Network faculty members. Online instruction time is designated within a student's daily class schedule. Eligible students must demonstrate academic maturity and independence to be approved by faculty and administration. Courses for the 2022-2023 school year include General Psychology, Financial Literacy, Intro to Neuroscience, Nutrition and Wellness, AP Human Geography, AP Macroeconomics, and AP Psychology.

## NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

Sacred Heart Academy students are nominated for induction into the National Honor Society based on GPA, number of advanced and honors courses taken, and commitment to service. Students are elected based on the four pillars of NHS: character, scholarship, leadership, and service. Faculty input is also taken into consideration. In the Class of 2023, 10 of 28 students are members of NHS.

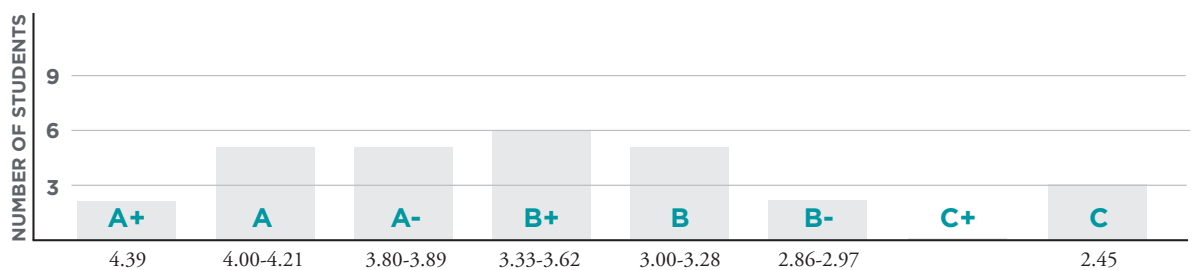
## DIOCESAN SCHOLARS

Diocesan Scholarships are awarded to select students in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. Four members of Sacred Heart Academy's Class of 2023 have been awarded a Diocesan Scholarship for the 2022-2023 academic year. These recipients have the opportunity to enroll in one college class per semester during their senior year of high school.

## COMMUNITY SERVICE

Sacred Heart Academy Bryn Mawr students prioritize community service. Traditionally, each student completes a minimum of twenty five hours of service a year. Students complete service through school programming and individual initiative. During the 2020-2022 academic years, as a result of limited in-person service availability, students engaged in independent service learning projects and a reduction of hours.
