Campus Update

The students at CMP Shingle Springs are nearly half-way through the normalization period, and I am happy to share we are settling in nicely to routines, building community, and engaging in learning. I am impressed by the productive buzz as I walk through classrooms, and how quickly the students have transitioned back into learning.

The first month has brought excitement for our three fall sports: Cross County, Girls' Volleyball, and Flag Football. I am proud of our Hawks student athletes experiencing success on the field, court, and trails, but more importantly, they are learning the value of teamwork, dedication, and hard work.

Our food service program has been embraced by our community, and we are pleased to report we are serving an average of 140 breakfasts and 250 lunches for free thanks to the California Universal Meals program. With the high-price of gas and groceries, we are extremely grateful to offer nutritious meals to all of our TK-8th grade students in partnership with our authorizing district, Buckeye Union School District. This new program has also brought new opportunities for our older students to volunteer and earn community service hours by helping our food service workers serve meals, and by helping to maintain our garbage system. Sorting our food and liquid waste, and stacking cardboard trays has made a tremendous impact on our waste!
