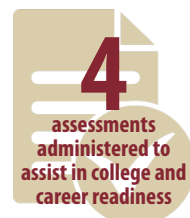
## PREPARATION FOR COLLEGE AND BEYOND

CHS students take four assessments each year of high school (*Multiple Intelligences, Holland Career Code, Myers-Briggs Personality Indicator, YouScience Aptitude Test*) to understand how God has uniquely designed and hard-wired them in order to better understand a plan and purpose for their life. They may not leave CHS knowing all of the answers, but they will leave asking themselves the essential questions.

Each fall and spring, CHS high school students research, schedule, and attend a college admissions tour. By the time of graduation, students have visited *over 10 different colleges and universities* as a class.

## THE CLASSROOM

As a student-centered institution, CHS offers a variety of teaching methodologies, including but not limited to, problem and project-based learning methods through methods such as *Harkness* and *discussion-based humanities courses*. These methods promote robust engagement in critical thinking and persuasive articulation of student conclusions.
