COMMUNITY: Moon Area School District educates more than 4020 students from Crescent and Moon Townships. There are 272 students in the Class of 2023. The district covers an approximate 26 square mile attendance area, is 15 miles from the City of Pittsburgh and only minutes from the Pittsburgh International Airport. The ethnic/racial composition of the district is: 73.15% White/Caucasian, 5.92% Black/African American, 4.62% Asian Pacific Islander, 9.25% Hispanic, 6.89% Multi-Racial, .08% Native American, 0.08% Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander. 24.17% of the student body qualifies for the free/reduced lunch program. 3.81% of our students are enrolled in our English Language Development Program.

COVID STATEMENT: Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Moon Area School District was physically closed from March 13, 2020 to the end of the 2019-2020 school year. Online instruction replaced in-person instruction during this time, however the same standards of attendance and grading were upheld throughout the closure. We started the 2020-2021 school year in virtual, synchronous learning, with most of our students returning to school four days a week (Wednesdays were virtual days) on October 13. The remainder of the school year, we vacillated between being in-person and 100% virtual. Students had the choice to remain virtual for the entire school year. The 2021-2022 school year was 100% in person, 5 days a week. Throughout the pandemic, grades were calculated in their traditional letter grade format using all four marking periods equally. We are committed to providing a safe and equitable learning environment for our students, staff, and community members. Student equity and health are the highest priority for our district.

CURRICULUM: Moon Area High School offers a wide program of studies that includes classes at all academic ability levels. A student’s program of study largely depends on course availability in a given year and teacher recommendations. A typical high school schedule contains between six and seven credits of coursework each year. There is no limit to the number of Honors or AP courses a student can take each year. Moon students have the option to study one of the 16 career, technical, and pre-professional programs at Parkway West Career and Technology Center. This regional CTC offers half-day, accredited programs for high school students. Moon currently has 120 students enrolled at Parkway West.

CALCULATION OF GRADE POINT AVERAGE: GPA is calculated at the end of each school year, using only final grades for each course. Honors and AP classes are weighted. The GPA is reported on a 4.0 scale. Class rank is not calculated or reported.

CONTINUING EDUCATION: Approximately 83% of Moon Area High School graduates pursue a post-secondary education. 71% enroll in four-year colleges, 12% enroll in two-year colleges, 2% of students join the military and 6% enter the workforce. The remaining 9% are undecided or are taking time off before furthering their education.

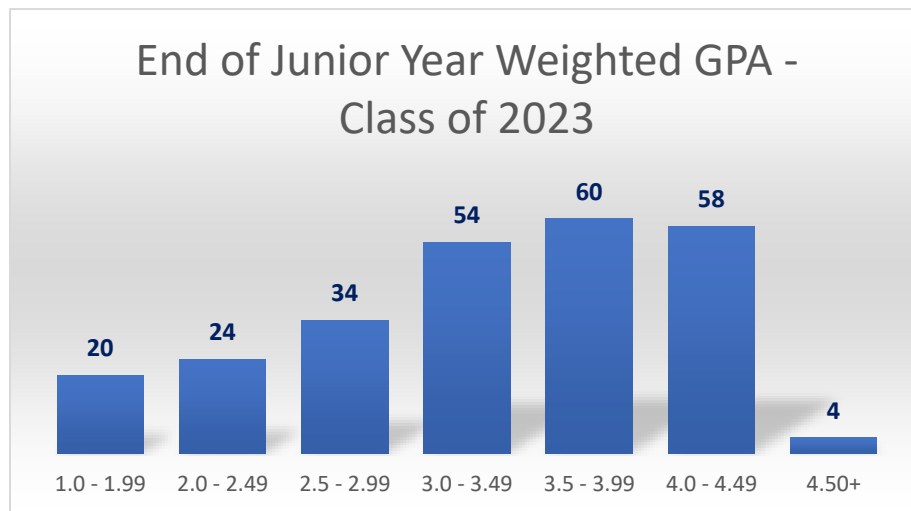

College Entrance Examinations:

Approximately 45% of the class of 2022 took the SAT and 10% took the ACT (down from 51% and 12% respectively from the class of 2021).

With significantly lower participation in SAT and ACT testing, we are not reporting middle 50% bands for either test. Understanding test scores correlate strongly with socio-economic status, we hope you look deeper at our students' grades and courses as they are a stronger indicator of success in higher education.
