B. CSUCI Summer College Experience Students

Students from ACHS, HHS and OHS, through a Summer Student Program between OUHSD and CSUCI, participated in a university course taught by a university professor, Communications 101. During this five-week course students gained knowledge to speak before an audience, and research and present on topics such as Cognitive Restricting, Growth Mindset, Imposter Syndrome, White Savior Complex, Glass Ceiling and the Transactional Model of Communication.

Trustees and Dr. Hall thanked Dr. Connie Cervera and Ms. Reyes-Castillo for restoring this program. Dr. Cervera thanked HHS SLIFE Teacher, Erendira Soria for her support by tutoring these students. - Trustee Botello thanked Dr. McCoy and Mr. Lawrence for the electric bus program coming into fruition.
 - OUHSD has approximately 15 buses in the transportation fleet and half are electric. The older diesel buses, with higher mileage, would be replaced by the four new electric buses the district is expecting through the Clean School Bus Program Grant.
 - Electric buses are better for the home to school runs due to their mileage limitation. The diesel buses are better for long distance trips.
 - The early sale of the final \$100,000,000 of the Measure A Bond, two years early, would save \$57,800,000 of interest, over the life of the bond, for OUHSD property owners.
 - The term of the bonds, which were refinanced, was not extended.

- The agreement and fees are for a one-year term at this time and if the need is reflected in the data, then another year, or longer term for a cost reduction, would be considered..
- Mr. Adams isn't aware of which teams would like to participate, but would provide this information to Trustees in a Friday Update.
- The Wellness Specialists, after working with Principal Urias and researching the survey data, felt the need to bring this item forward.

15. STAFF REPORT AND BOARD DISCUSSION

A. Black and African American Education Advisory Committee

Dr. Freda Rossi and Mr. Adams shared updates of the Black and African American Education Advisory Committee and noted that discussions and planning meetings with stakeholders are ongoing.

- The committee meetings take place quarterly, four times per year.
- Eight parents, site Principals and Educational Services staff participated last year.
- Dr. Rossi affirmed the Pinkard Institute is actively involved in this committee.
- Dr. Rossi stated the March meeting would take place during Women's Month and she plans to invite Black Female Leaders from the area.
- Professional Development (PD) trainings were offered August 4-5, 2022 and the BAAEAC teachers participated. Ongoing training is expected at the October 17 PD.
- Trustee Sher recommended inviting our feeder district leaders to the October 17 PD.
- Trustee Botello recommended that a parent newsletter or some type of communication for staff and families to receive updates of all district advisory committees, via social media or a link on the district website, be made available.
- Dr. Rossi stated that Mr. Fundi Legohn actively participated last year in the committee.

B. Asian, Filipino, Pacific Islander Advisory Committee

Dr. Freda Rossi and Mr. Adams shared updates of the Asian, Filipino, Pacific Islander Advisory Committee and noted that discussions and planning meetings with stakeholders are ongoing.

- CIHS is the district's most populated school with Asian, Filipino and Pacific Islander students. ACHS, OHS and PHS have higher populations than previous years.
- The Filipino language course has been written and A-G approval has been acquired; however, the district is unable to find an instructor for this course.
- The committee meetings take place quarterly, four times per year.
- The committee membership is fluid at this time.

C. High School Attendance Area Update #1

As the District prepares to open Del Sol High School for the 2023-2024 school year, the attendance area boundaries for all District comprehensive high schools will be adjusted to create an attendance area for DSHS and to balance enrollment across the seven comprehensive high schools currently within OUHSD.

Dr. McCoy presented updated information on the process and timeline for approving new attendance area boundaries for the seven comprehensive high schools.

The updated attendance area boundaries will take effect one grade level at a time, beginning with 9th grade students in the 2023-2024 school year.


