District Reports

- District Librarian Trish Henry presented a report that reviewed the current Library Media Policy and Procedure 2021. The presentation covered current process for how the district obtains books, stocks libraries and reviews titles, as well as the process for a community member to put in a formal request for a book review.
- Assistant Superintendent Heather Havens presented a report that reviewed the current Curriculum Adoption Policy and Procedure 2020. The presentation covered the full cycle of curriculum adoption, including research and review, public input, curriculum adoption committee recommendations, board review and ultimately board approval.
- Director of Secondary Education Darren Nelson presented a report on the current Civics Education in the District. The presentation covered a sampling of current civics-related classes in the school district, walked through the state standards with which those classes are aligned.

Business Items

- The second reading of Policy 2401 Civics Education was brought forth for review and discussion by the Board. Each board member shared their view of the proposed policy prior to a motion for action. The proposed policy failed by a 3-2 vote.
- The second reading of revised Policy 2021 Library Media Center was brought forth for review and discussion. Each board member shared their view of the proposed revision to the current policy prior to a motion for action. The proposed policy failed by a vote of 4-0 with one board member abstaining.
