Know Did You

In the Fall of 2021, we worked with our community to collect feedback about **the strategic direction of our District**. We received more than 1,400 survey responses, conducted over 100 interviews, and hosted two Ideas Fairs. Our Ideas Fairs were community events featuring interactive stations focusing on topics ranging from diversity to extracurricular activities. We then compiled this data and submitted it to the Wisconsin Center for Education Research for analysis.

A committee of administrators, staff, and community members met for several weeks in the Spring of 2022, using the analysis to create **a new Strategic Framework** for the Sun Prairie Area School District.

The new framework centers on three cultures we want to promote in our District: **Educational Excellence, Engagement and Inclusion, and Operational Excellence.** Promoting these cultures allows us to live and embrace our District's vision and mission. 

We support approximately 3,000 4K–12 students in our Summer School Program, which provides our youngest learners (4K) with an introduction to what school will be like in kindergarten and our oldest students (9–12) with credit-earning classes. Students have the opportunity to strengthen their skills in math, reading, physical education, art, music, tech ed, and many other areas through a wide variety of enrichment classes aligning with core content area standards. Middle and high school students can also participate in a robust strength and conditioning physical education program. During the program, teachers are encouraged to use the outdoors as much as possible for their "learning laboratories." Most of our Summer School staff are teachers and support staff who work with our students during the regular school year.

Beyond our five-week Summer School program, students can take music, agriculture, and theatre classes throughout July and August. Other learning opportunities include a middle and high school orientation, advanced placement "boot camps" for high school students taking college-level courses in the upcoming school year, and the **Sound of Sun Prairie.** The Sound of Sun Prairie, which is celebrating its 50th anniversary, is an extracurricular marching band composed of dozens of students in grades 8–12. The Sun Prairie Area School District offers **career and technical education programs** at Sun Prairie high schools. Students can explore careers in agriculture, business and information technology, health science, marketing, family and consumer science, and technology and engineering education. These programs are designed to **prepare youth for a broad range of employment and training opportunities** and are offered under the guidance of certified teachers and counselors.

Our District has a School-to-Career Program that allows students to develop their potential in life through combining rigorous school-based and work-based learning with greater career exploration and guidance. **Students are able to earn high school credit from work experience** by participating in a youth apprenticeship or a work-based learning agreement. This program has grown from six students working jobs in the printing industry to nearly 30 working in a variety of career areas.
