FOOTBALL GETS WIN IN HOME OPENER; SOCCER GOES UNBEATEN AT ANNUAL INVITE

NOTRE DAME TAKES HOME OPENER OVER LHN

The Notre Dame Varsity Football team moved to 2-1 on the season with a convincing 50-7 win over Lutheran North. The Irish jumped out to a 13-0 lead following the first quarter as Jacob Tuttle threw touchdown passes to Evan Hoke (15 yards) and Zach Conroy (19 yards). The lead would grow to 35-0 heading into halftime courtesy of two Zach Mylenek touchdown runs (25 and one yards) and a punt block that was recovered in the end zone by Evan Gaeschke. Mylenek would add a 20-yard touchdown run in the third quarter and Roman Cherfoli rounded out the scoring with a nine-yard touchdown run in the fourth. Defensively, Drew Heimbuch finished with five tackles while Gaeschke and Sergio Gasperoni each had four. Caden Husch added an interception while Landon Hehl had three tackles and a sack.

IRISH COMPETE AT CHALLENGING AVERILL INVITE

The Notre Dame Girls and Boys Cross Country teams competed at the Averill Invitational on the very difficult Possum Hollow course at Kensington on Saturday finishing third and 12th, respectively. Maria Nunning (third), Skylar Vanhecke 10th, and Sydney Schulte 14th all medaled for the girls. For Schulte, it was her first varsity medal in only the second race of her career. Addison Mikel and Mary Larocca rounded out the scoring for the Irish. Violet Dedivanaj was the top team finisher in the JV race and

Jamie Thomas set a personal record despite the challenging course with multiple hills and temperature in the mid 80's. Ben Kinkade was the lone medal winner for the boys finishing 15th overall. Isaak Brook, Ryan Wojichowski, Chris Hunter, and Nick Mardelli rounded out the scoring for the boys. Jack Leuchtmann did well in his first varsity race and Vinny Tartaglia set a personal record in the varsity race.

IRISH GO UNBEATEN AT ANNUAL TOURNAMENT

The Notre Dame Boys Varsity Soccer team finished 1-0-2 at an annual rotating tournament that also includes Flushing, Frankenmuth and Groves. The Irish started the day with a convincing 2-0 win over Flushing. Matthew Marsheh and Joey Liparoto both netted goals for Notre Dame with Felipe Sanchez-Montalvo picking up two assists. In the second game, the Irish battled to a 1-1 draw with Frankenmuth. Will Lanham had the game-tying goal on a penalty kick for the Notre Dame. Immediately after, the Irish stayed on the field to battle Groves to a 1-1 draw on their home turf. Marsheh had the lone Irish goal in the match with Alex Ruschak drawing an assist.

IRISH FINISH UNBEATEN IN HOME QUAD

The Notre Dame Varsity Volleyball team went 3-0 at a quad that also featured Our Lady of the Lakes, L'Anse Creuse North and Linden. The Irish (21-6-1) opened up against the Lakers and took the match in three sets; 25-9, 22-25, 25-15. Grace

Wenaas led the attack with nine kills in 12 attempts. Bree Blakeslee added with nine kills and Delaney Zielke kicked in six kills. Sophia Sermo served up 10 points, three on aces, while also leading on serve reception with eight. Mya Kattula contributed 12 service points, four aces and had eight assists while Margo Sudzina dished out 23 assists. Next up was the Crusaders from L'Anse Creuse North. The Irish came out strong on their way to a 25-10, 26-16 win. It was Wenaas leading the way again with 13 kills in 18 attempts while also serving up six points, including a pair of aces. Blakeslee had 12 kills, Kattula added six kills while handing out 10 assists and Sudzina added 12 assists. Aly Berent had six points, with three aces and seven service receptions without an error. The final match saw Notre Dame take on Linden, who the Irish split with earlier this season at a tournament This time it was all Irish as they handed Linden a 25-11, 25-11 loss. The Irish kept the Eagles out of system for much of the match with aggressive serving and well-placed attacks. Wenaas added 11 more kills, six points and three aces. Kattula collected seven kills and dished out six assists. Blakeslee had six kills while Sudzina added 19 more assists to her team leading totals along with seven points and two more aces. Audrey Thummel and Sermo had seven points with Thummel also adding a pair of aces.

Coming off a victory at the SMISL Relay meet over Adrian, Tecumseh, Bedford and Detroit Country Day over the weekend, the Notre Dame Girls Varsity Swim team dropped a very close meet to Detroit Country Day by a final score of 94-92. Despite the loss, the Irish continued to drop times and earned more state cuts. First place finisheds and state cuts were achieved by Alex Williams in the 200 Free, Grace Linenfelser in the 500 Free and Emma Ciesla in the 100 Breaststroke. Williams also took first in the 100 Free with Rita Hajjar placing third and Mia Palizzi taking sixth. Cielsa won the 100 Butterfly while Mariana Spada placed third and Cat Zaleski took sixth. Tori Devine, Aria Kim and Spada took second, fourth and fifth in the 200 IM. Olivia Powell was fourth in the 200 Free and second in the 100 Backstroke while Kim and Devine took third and fourth in the 100 Backstroke, Lauren Choinacki had fifth place finishes in the 200 Free and 100 Breaststroke and Hajjar, Linenfelser and Mia Skandalaris took third through fifth in the 50 Free. Skandalaris also took third in the 500 Free while Lexi Hunter came in fifth. Hunter went on to swim the 100 Breaststroke with a sixth place finish. In the final match of pool play, the Irish defeated Kalamazoo Central 25-18, 25-13 to earn the second seed heading into bracket play. The Notre Dame IV Football team earned a 27-8 win over Walled Lake Northern to move to 4-0 on the season. Neither team scored in the opening quarter, with Brody Sink ending two Knight drives with interceptions. The first Walled Lake Northern drive of the second quarter also came to a stop via an interception, this time by Aidan Mahoney. The Irish then put together the first scoring drive of the game with key plays being a Sam Stowe to Nick Kobylecki first down pass, followed by key runs by Stowe on a keeper and a hard run

by Andrew Brownell. Stowe kept up the air assault with a first down pass to Colin Whalen and the drive was capped with a touchdown run by Lucas Bigelow. Owen Fulsher added the extra point, his first of three extra points on the night. The Knights attempted to tie the score before halftime but were driven back by a goal line stand by the defensive line of James McCowan, Tyler Leung, Henry Ewles and Adrian Fernandez. The half ended with a hard stop by Mark Galle on a Knight reception at the two yard line, keeping the score at 7-0.
