

One teacher friend of mine – she has taught in the same Catholic school since the early 1980s – recently made this observation: "Teaching is a labor of love, and it involves a lot of hidden sacrifice. No one wants to do that anymore."

To live a life of hidden sacrifice. That's really the Christian call in every walk of life. Parents do it every day. Priests and religious are called to the same heroic sacrifice, as are members of the military and first responders. We know it when we see it lived-out humbly and without fanfare, and we admire the dedication that one person has to helping others, especially the most vulnerable among us.

Which is why we must do better at praying for and thanking the teachers who give so much to educate our young people.

This weekend our Church celebrates Catechetical Sunday, a time to recognize the women and men who dedicate their lives – both in our school and our religious education programs – to shaping young minds and hearts, especially in the ways of Christ and our Catholic faith. Quite often, these teachers may very well be the only persons outside their immediate family who talk to them about Jesus. They may be the only adults who share with them the Gospel message of mercy, forgiveness and truth.

Sadly, we can't necessarily depend on the culture or the media to help instill virtues and values that we want the next generations to embrace. But we can depend on our teachers. They give more to us than we probably even realize.

This weekend, please offer a prayer for all educators, especially here at St Ann's School, in our religious education program, and at your child's/grandchildren's school. Remember, too, the teacher or coach who had an impact on your own faith journey, and thank God for their love and sacrifice. Maybe even drop them a note to tell them so.

To teach is to touch a life forever, and we are so blessed by the sacrifice and love of our teachers and catechists.


