On Wednesday, Y3 learned about the Beaker people. These prehistoric groups arrived to the UK from Spain and Portugal, replacing 90% of Britons' ancestry. The name 'Beaker People' comes from the distinctive clay beakers that were so treasured, they were included in the graves of their dead which is where archaeologists have uncovered them. Year 3 looked at a variety of photographed examples of the intricately decorated vessels and learned how scientists believe the decorations were created. They then made their own replica versions out of clay and the end results will be on display in the Junior School soon.








Reception News


