Orange-Ulster BOCES Student Acceptable Use Guidelines for Computers

Introduction

The Orange-Ulster BOCES has established a computer network and is pleased to offer Internet access for student use. This will allow students access to a variety of Internet resources. In order for students to use the Internet, students and their parents or guardians must first read and understand the following acceptable use guidelines.

Acceptable Uses

- The computer network in the Orange-Ulster BOCES has been set up in order to allow Internet
 access for educational purposes. This includes classroom activities, research activities, and the
 exchange of project-related ideas with other classes. This may include participation in the JASON
 Project, National Geographic Kids Network or other established programs.
- 2. Students will have access to the Internet via school computers.
- 3. Student use of the Internet is contingent upon parent/guardian permission in the form of a signed copy of this Acceptable Use Policy. Parents/guardians may revoke approval at any time.
- 4. Material created and/or stored on the system is not private. School administrators and appropriate staff may review the system from time to time to ensure that the system is being used properly. For this reason, students should expect that any work created and/or stored on the network may be viewed by a third party.
- 5. Assigned passwords should be kept private. Accounts and/or passwords may not be shared.
- 6. Computer users are expected to adhere to the safety guidelines listed below.

Safety Guidelines for Students

- 1. Never give out your last name, address, or phone number, and never post your photograph.
- 2. Never agree to meet in person with anyone you have met online unless you first have the approval of a parent or guardian.
- Notify an adult immediately if you receive a message that may be inappropriate or if you encounter any material that violates this Acceptable Use Policy.

Unacceptable Uses

- The network may not be used to download, copy, or store any software, shareware, or freeware without prior permission from BOCES staff. The students are not permitted to disable any security or Anti-Virus software.
- 2. The network may not be used for "commercial" purposes.
- 3. Use of the network for "advertising" or political lobbying is prohibited.
- 4. The network may not be used for any activity, or to transmit any material, that violates the United States or local laws. This includes, but is not limited to, illegal activities such as threatening the safety of another person or violating copyright laws.
- 5. Computer users may not use vulgar, derogatory, or obscene language. Users may not engage in personal attacks, harass another person, or post private information about another person.
- 6. Computer users may not log on to someone else's account or attempt to access another user's files. "Hacking" or otherwise trying to gain access to another person's or organization's computer system is prohibited.
- 7. Computer users may not access Web sites, news groups, or any chat areas that contain material that is obscene or that promotes illegal acts. If a user accidentally accesses this type of information, he or she should immediately notify BOCES staff.
- 8. Computer users may not engage in "spamming" (sending email to more than 10 people a the same time) or participate in chain letters.

Violation of Acceptable Use Guidelines

Students violating the above policy will be dealt with on an individual basis. Students may lose computer and/or network privileges or face legal action where federal or state laws are violated.

Notice of Family Education Rights and Privacy Act

September 2024

Dear Parents and Guardians:

This is to advise you of your rights with respect to your child's school records pursuant to the Federal Law known as the "Family Education Rights and Privacy Act of 1974." Under the provisions of this law, parents of a student under 18 (or a student who is 18 years of age or older) have a right to inspect and review any and all official records, files and data directly related to their child (or themselves) including all material that is incorporated into the student's cumulative record folder and intended for school use or to be available to parties outside the school or school system, and specifically including, but not necessarily limited to: identifying data, academic work completed, level of achievement scores on standardized, intelligence, aptitude and psychological tests, interest inventory results, health data, family background information, teacher or counselor ratings and observation and verified reports of serious or recurrent behavior patterns.

Parents and students are also entitled to an opportunity for a hearing to challenge the content of such records, to ensure that they are not inaccurate, misleading or otherwise in violation of the privacy or other rights of students, and to provide an opportunity for the correction or deletion of any such inaccurate, misleading or otherwise inappropriate data contained therein. Any questions concerning the procedure to be followed in requesting such a hearing should be directed to James Higgins, Director of Special Education, Orange-Ulster BOCES, 53 Gibson Road, Goshen, New York 10924.

Student records and any material contained therein which is personally identifiable, with the exception of "directory information," (see the enclosed Parent Notification Regarding the Release of Information) are confidential and may not be released or made available to persons other than parents or students without the written consent of such parents or students (if over age 18). There are a number of exceptions to this rule such as: Court Orders, other school employees, other schools that have requested records for any student who is enrolled or seeks, intends, or is instructed to enroll in the school, certain State and Federal officials, etc. who have a legitimate educational need to access such records in the course of their employment or normal duties and responsibilities.

The following procedures shall be applicable for making student records available to parents of students under eighteen years of age or to a student eighteen years of age or older:

- A. All student records shall be available only during regular office hours from the office of the appropriate Program Director within BOCES.
- B. Such records shall be attainable only from those administrators and other personnel designated by the District Superintendent of Schools through a written request specifically outlining the material to be reviewed.
- C. Any document included in the student record folder may be examined within the said offices of the BOCES and may not be removed there from, provided such records are not then in use or needed by the office personnel in the discharge of their regular office duties.
- D. Documents may be copied by photocopier or other mechanical devices at a cost of 25¢ per face of each document.
- E. Parents who wish to challenge the content of their child's school records shall identify in writing the record or records, which they believe to be inaccurate, misleading or otherwise in violation of the privacy or other rights of the student, together with a statement of the reasons for their challenge to the record. This written challenge shall be submitted to the Program Director for a reply.
- F. The Director shall provide a written response to a parental challenge within fifteen (15) working days of receipt of that challenge.
- G. If a parent requests a hearing following the written response of the Director, it shall be granted within thirty (30) working days by the District Superintendent or his designee. Upon completion of the hearing, a written decision shall be rendered within ten (10) working days by the official before whom the hearing was held. A copy of the decision will be mailed to the person(s) requesting the hearing and one copy will be affixed to the records of the student in question.

If you have any question regarding the provisions of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act or the BOCES policy with respect to this law, please do not hesitate to contact my office.

Hearing Impairment Accommodation

Dear Parent, Guardian, and School Staff,

New York State Education Law Section 409-H, effective July 1, 2001, requires all public and nonpublic elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year.

Orange-Ulster BOCES is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide applications. The following pesticide applications are <u>not</u> subject to prior notification requirements:

- a school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72-hours following an application;
- anti-microbial products;
- nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- nonvolatile insecticidal baits in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- silica gels and other nonvolatile ready-to-use pastes, foams, or gels in areas inaccessible to children;
- boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate;
- the application of EPA designated biopesticides;
- the application of EPA designated exempt materials under 40CFR152.25;
- the use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps, and hornets.

In the event of an emergency application necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health, a good faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list.

If you would like to receive 48-hour prior notification of pesticide applications that are scheduled to occur in your school, please complete the attached form and return to your student's program or directly to our Health & Safety Department at Orange-Ulster BOCES, 53 Gibson Road, Goshen, NY 10924. PARENTAL NOTIFICATION REGARDING THE RELEASE OF INFORMATION

Dear Parent or Guardian:

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), a Federal law, requires that Orange-Ulster BOCES, with certain exceptions, obtain your written consent prior to the disclosure of personally identifiable information from your child's education records. However, Orange-Ulster BOCES may disclose appropriately designated "directory information" without written consent, unless you have advised Orange-Ulster BOCES to the contrary. The primary purpose of directory information is to allow the Orange-Ulster BOCES to include information from your child's education records in certain school publications.

Directory information, which is information that is generally not considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if released, can also be disclosed to outside organizations without a parent's prior written consent. Outside organizations include, but are not limited to, companies that manufacture class rings or publish yearbooks. In addition, two federal laws require local educational agencies (LEAs) receiving assistance under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, as amended (ESEA) to provide military recruiters, upon request, with the following information – names, addresses and telephone listings – unless parents have advised the LEA that they do no want their student's information disclosed without their prior written consent. [Note: These laws are Section 9528 of the ESEA (20 U.S.C. § 7908) and 10 U.S.C. § 503(c).]

If you do not want Orange-Ulster BOCES to disclose any or all of the types of information designated below as directory information from your child's education records without your prior written consent, you must notify the Orange-Ulster BOCES in writing by September 13, 2024. Orange-Ulster BOCES has designated the following information as directory information:

- Student's name
- · Student's address
- Student's telephone listing
- Date and place of birth
- Grade level
- Participation in officially recognized sports and activities
- Weight and height (for members of athletic teams)
- Dates of attendance
- · Honors, degrees and awards received

- Email address
- Name of educational institution previously attended
- Student ID number, user ID or other unique personal identifier used to
 communicate in electronic systems but only if the identifier cannot be used
 to gain access to education records except when used in conjunction with
 one or more factors that authenticate the user's identity, such as a PIN,


