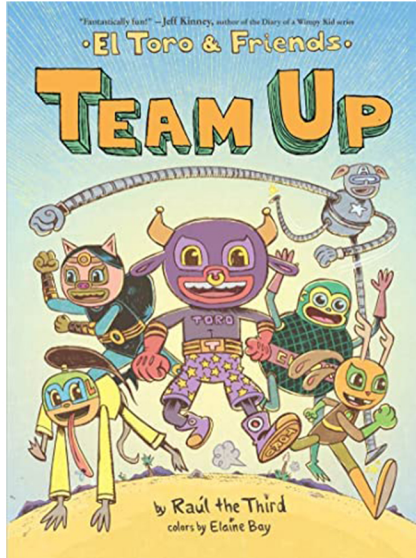

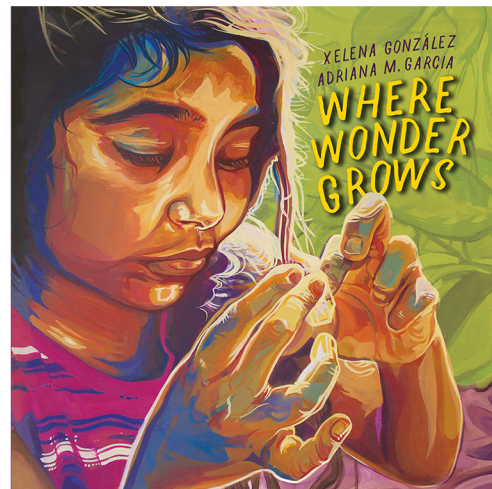

(ages: 4 - 7)

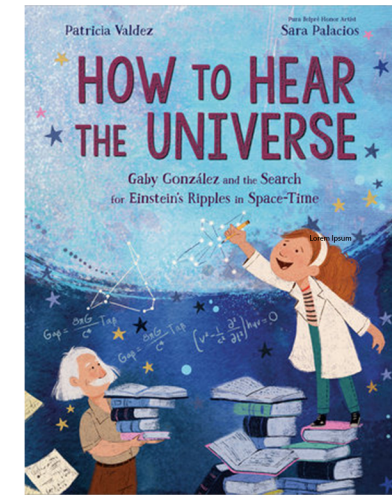
Find out how El Toro and his friends became such a great team in this action-packed and hilarious graphic novel.

(ages: 6 - 10)

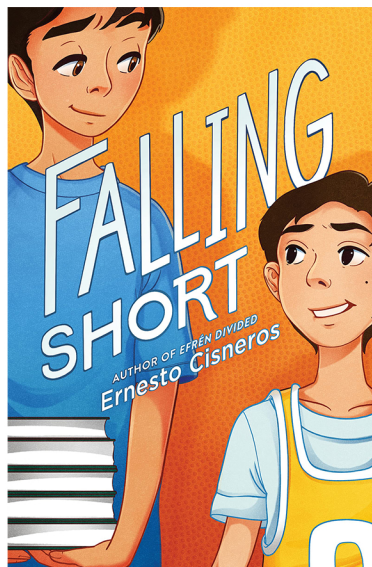
Discover the amazing story of Gaby Gonzalez, who picked up where Einstein left off and broke ground for new space-time research.

(ages: 8 - 12)

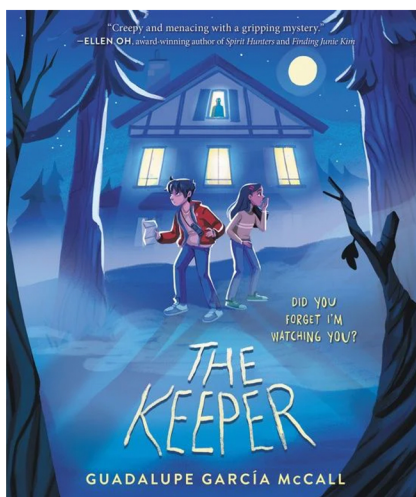
Two best friends, one athletically gifted and one academically gifted, have more in common than they realize when their goals intersect, forcing them to find a way to support each other so they don't fall short.

(ages: 8 - 12)

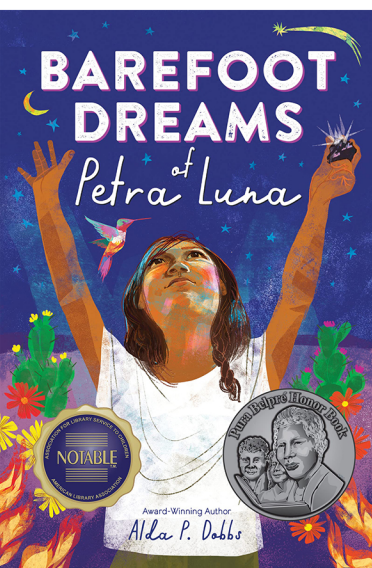

(ages: 9 - 13)

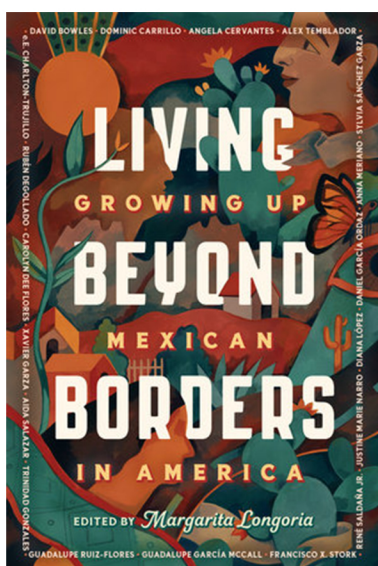
After her mother dies and her father is dragged away by soldiers during the Mexican Revolution, twelve-year-old Petra Luna will do anything to keep her family safe.

(ages: 10 - 14)

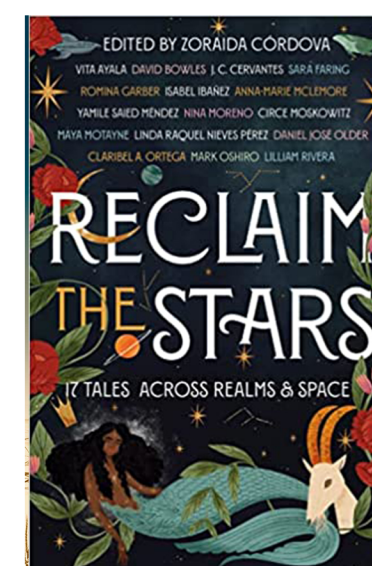
Five very different students who are forced together by their school to complete community service may just have more in common than they thought. This graphic novel features text in both English and Spanish.

(ages: 12 - 18)

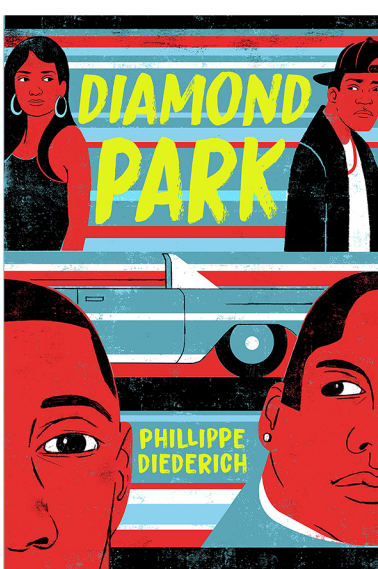
Travel to the stars, across time and realms, and in the magical now with tales that take the Latin American diaspora to places fantastical and out of this world.

(ages: 14+)

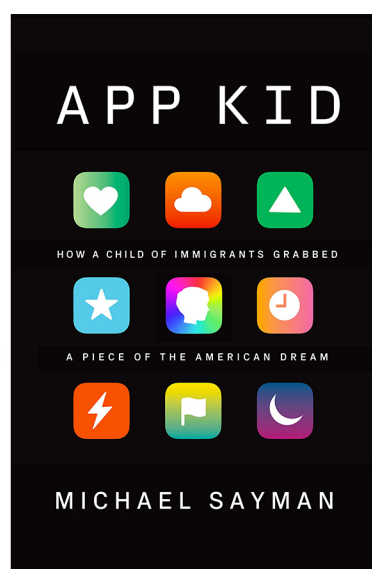
This novel and Pura Belpre Honor book explores identity, found families, and the power of food, all nestled within a courageous and intensely loyal Chicanx community.
