World Language Credit by Proficiency for 9th to 12th graders



Who can earn World Language Credit by Proficiency?

Any student in LWSD in grades 9 through 12 who can read, write, listen, and speak in a language other than English.

What are the benefits of taking the World Language Proficiency Test?

Students can earn up to four high school credits depending on the level of proficiency demonstrated in reading, writing, listening, and speaking. The credits earned may also count towards graduation requirements and may qualify the student for earning the Seal of Biliteracy.

Which languages are eligible for credit?

Assessments are available in many languages that have written and spoken forms, as well as American Sign Language. Every effort will be made to provide an assessment in the requested language.

How are credits determined?

Credits are awarded based on the lowest level of proficiency demonstrated across the skill areas, so it is important that students have strong skills in all four areas.

How much does testing cost?

The first language test comes at no cost to the student. If a student chooses to retest, there will be a fee based on the cost of the assessment (typically between \$25 - \$185).

Community Ride JUANITA

On-demand service costs the same as a bus ride.



Juanita Community Ride service hours

Monday–Friday: 7 a.m.–7 p.m.

Community Ride is an on-demand, point-to-point service that can connect you to a Park & Ride, transit center or anywhere in the service area.



How to pay

Community Ride costs the same as a bus ride. Pay your fare using an ORCA card, cash, paper transfer or Transit Go mobile ticket. Transfers to other Metro services are included with a fare paid on Community Ride.

Adults (19 and older)	\$2.75
Youth (6–18 years old)	\$1.50

How to ride

Use Community Ride in four easy steps:

- 1 Download the Community Ride app
- 2 Select your pick-up and drop-off location
- 3 Check if the estimated pick-up and drop-off times work with your schedule
- 4 Book your trip and catch your ride!

Juanita High Students Can Take Advantage of ‘Community Ride’ Point-to-Point Transportation Service

The Juanita Community Ride service is a public transportation service by King County Metro. It is FREE for people 18 and under (like all Metro transit services), and it is designed to serve people in the greater Juanita area, where fixed-route bus service is limited.

When can I get a ride? The Community Ride shuttles operate Monday to Friday, 7a.m. to 7 p.m.

Where can I be picked up and dropped off? Community Ride is a point-to-point service, meaning the driver can pick you up and drop you off at any address within the service area. (Community Ride does not rely on the typical King County Metro bus stops.) Check out the map of the service area in the attached flyer or on the Community Ride webpage (link below).

Do I request a ride using an app? Yes, the Community Ride app is in the App Store and the Google Play Store. You can also request a ride by calling 1-855-233-6043.

Can I bring my bike? Community Ride vehicles are equipped with bike racks just like regular Metro buses.
