Samaritan's Wellness Screen Program is going Paperless!

Our school district will once again partner with Samaritan's Wellness Screen Program. Wellness Screen will provide a wellness screening to students in specific grade levels throughout the school year. Parents will receive electronic notifications prior to the Wellness Screen start date. The Wellness Screen is FREE to students, CONFIDENTIAL (results will not be shared with school staff without written permission), and VOLUNTARY (students and parents may opt-out of the program). Wellness is a critical part of academic success. Early identification of wellness health concerns allows for early intervention and higher success rates in resolving concerns. High School Drug Testing Policy

In May 2007, the Board of Education of the Unified School District of De Pere adopted two policies specific to our students, related to Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse (AODA):

- 2431.01 RANDOM SUSPICIONLESS DRUG TESTING OF STUDENTS, and
- 2431.02 RANDOM ALCOHOL TESTING

These policies are based on our commitment to providing students and employees the right to attend and work at school and school functions in an environment free from the nonmedical use of alcohol, drugs, and mood-altering substances. The policies were not routinely practiced during the COVID-19 pandemic when in-school learning and most extra-curricular activities were put on hold. Now that we have returned to in-person classes and events, we will be restarting both Random Suspicionless Drug Testing of Students and Random Alcohol Testing.

2431.01 Random Suspicionless Drug Testing of Students

As outlined in this policy, the following groups of students will be eligible for random suspicionless drug testing:

- Co-curricular participants
- Students who register to park a motor vehicle in a district parking lot
- The DREAM TEAM (students who sign a promise not to use alcohol or illegal drugs*)

Students eligible in each pool of students (co-curricular participants and students requesting parking permits) will be assigned a number by school administration. Random draws of numbers will be conducted weekly. A designated number of student participant numbers will be drawn each week.

*The students and at least one (1) parent, if the student is a minor, must give a signed consent for drug testing should the student be drawn at random from a pool of eligible "D.R.E.A.M. Team" students.

Students who test positive for illegal drugs will be subject to consequences as outlined in the Co-Curricular Code of Conduct, the Parking Permit Application and the Student/Parent Handbook. Students will have an opportunity within twenty-four (24) hours of notification of the first positive test result to have the split sample tested at the family's expense.

2431.02 Random Alcohol Testing

As outlined in this policy, it is our expectation that all school activities will be drug and alcohol free. A random Breathalyzer system of testing will be used at dances, prom, and other school activities as deemed appropriate by school administration. While this system targets those who may have ingested alcohol, it should be noted that all other substance abuse policies of the Unified School District of De Pere Board of Education and Wisconsin Administrative Code are also in effect at all school activities.

No Outside Food Deliveries & Deliveries & Carry Ins

Until further notice students are not allowed to have restaurant prepared food delivered to the school by a delivery service. Students are also not allowed to bring in outside food orders when returning from

Release, Lunch or Appointments. This includes, but not limited to: McDonalds, Taco Bell, Subway, Cousins, Domino's, Pizza Hut, Moe's, Piggly Wiggly, etc.

SmartPass

De Pere High School students and staff began using SmartPass. SmartPass is a digital version of the sign-out sheet and paper passes that we have used in the past. It provides school staff an accurate account of a student's location when they are outside of the classroom during the school day, and allows staff to quickly identify the location of students who are outside of their classroom during an emergency situation/drill such as a fire drill.

Attendance FAQ's

If your student needs to leave for an appointment during the school day, or will be absent for the day/several days, please call/leave a message on the attendance line 920-983-9174, ext 4007 as early as possible. This will help to avoid classroom interruptions if the student is leaving. The message can be left at any time, including outside of school hours.

At the high school, parents do not need to come into the building to sign students out/in. Once students get a SmartPass from attendance, they are able to leave the building at the designated time. When they return, they simply stop by the attendance office to check in.

PreACT

On Wednesday, September 21st, we will be administering the PreACT assessment to 9th-11th grade students, while our 12th grade students will be working with our counselors and senior class advisors on graduation information and post-secondary planning. All students will be attending school for the entire day during our normal school hours with our 7:00am classes running in our normal time slot of 6:56-7:46. Parents of Juniors; PSAT/NMSQT

Attention Junior students and parent/guardian,

After reviewing the following PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) information you will need to express your intent to test, only should you decide to test, by no later than <u>Friday</u>, <u>September 30th at 3pm</u>.

The PSAT/NMSQT will be administered at **DPHS** on **Wednesday**, **October 12th 2022** for any interested Junior student. **It is important to note that this is an <u>OPTIONAL</u> standardized test and is <u>not required for students</u>. When determining if the PSAT/NMSQT is appropriate for the student to take, consider the following:**

- The two standardized college admissions exams are the <u>ACT</u> and the <u>SAT</u>. The ACT is by far the more common exam and Junior students are all given the opportunity to take the ACT at DPHS in the spring. The SAT, however, is a much less common exam. There is also the fact that many colleges are going to a test optional approach.
- The PSAT/NMSQT is a program co-sponsored by the College Board and National Merit Scholarship Corporation. It is a standardized test that provides first hand practice for the SAT. It may also give students a chance to enter NMSC scholarship programs and gain access to college and career planning tools. Most students taking the PSAT/NMSQT are in the top 5-10% of his/her class and may possibly have a parent working at a larger corporation in the area that recognizes the PSAT/NMSQT for their company scholarship eligibility.

Teens can obtain a permit in WI at age 15.

- Teens will not be allowed to apply for their probationary license until they are at least 16 years old, hold their permit for at least 6 months ticket free, practice hours of at least 50 hours and 10 of those at night, and have completed all of driver education (classroom and BTW lessons).
- Another change is that the **permit will be good for 18 months** instead of 12 months. The DMV has *not* announced when they will sunset the parental road test waiver; however the waiver program is ending and all 16-17 year olds **will have to take the road test**.

- The new law changes the number of practice hours required during the permit phase, it changed from 30 hours to 50 hours. The DMV does not collect the practice driving record when teens go for their road test however they may ask to see it or the Road Ready app which also tracks practice time.
- Your teen should work toward at least 100 hours of practice with 30 of those at night based on national recommendations put forth by AAA Foundation research in order to give novice drivers more experience before licensing (shows it reduces crashes after licensing). Our common goal for everyone is to have fewer crashes, injuries, and fatalities involving teens and all other drivers. Use of the Road Ready app is a great tool for them to track their progress of practice hours.

Who is eligible to enroll? Any student who is 14 years/10 months to 18 years old. Sign up information is located on the De Pere High School webpage under the "Students" tab under the Driver's Education link. You could also go to http://cesa2.com to access information regarding Driver's Education at De Pere High School. We also have paper forms that you can pick up in the high school office.

Hope Squad Parent Newsletter

Hope Squad is a school-based peer support team, made up of students who are nominated by their peers, that partners with local mental health agencies. Research shows that children and young adults who are contemplating suicide are more likely to reach out to their peers than the adults in their lives. In this way, Hope Squad members are the "eyes



and ears" of the school building – monitoring for warning signs of suicide and helping to connect their peers with staff members who can offer the appropriate resources in times of need. The Unified School District of De Pere has Hope Squad teams at Foxview, DPMS, and DPHS. Academic ineligibility/probation is based on the previous quarter's grades (4th quarter 21-22 school year).

On Sept. 22, students must have their teachers complete the proof of academic progress form. The student then should return the form to the athletics office by 3:15pm Sept 22..
