

Conferences are a great opportunity for one-on-one time with grade level and essentials teachers. This year we will be taking two days for conferences for families to have more 1:1 time with teachers. PreK-3rd conferences are between parent and teacher and 4th-8th is between parent/student and teacher.

Parking Lot

Your child's safety is our #1 priority. Parking lot etiquette is expected from all of our families, your child's caregivers and your extended family. Please remember:

- No phones or stay off phones in our parking lot
- Drive slowly and carefully
- Use crosswalks

Please model and support the development of positive life skills when crossing roads and navigating a parking lot safely with your student. PLEASE USE sidewalks and only cross at crosswalks.

CONTINUED from page 10. keep students safe! Please be kind if they ask you to move. Parents can provide their children permission to walk or bike ride to/from school as appropriate, given the age of the child and appropriate communication with the Aspen administration. We will continue on our staggered drop-off and pick-up times assigned by grade levels. For convenience, families with siblings are grouped together based on the older sibling's grades (start times) and the younger siblings' times (dismissal). Please refer to the Student & Family Guidebook (pages 47-51) for specifics. In order to ensure that families are able to park and retrieve their children at the appropriate time, we ask that parents or caretakers pick up children and immediately proceed home.

Field Trips

What is the school field trip uniform? Why is this required?

Field trips are back for the 2022-2023 school year! For safety reasons we ask all students to wear a specific field trip uniform: Black pants or skirt, white shirt with Aspen Academy logo. When we take our students into the community, we are proudly representing our school as well as optimizing the safety of each child. A black and white consistent uniform allows our chaperones to keep everyone in direct sight. Please refer to the Family & Student Guidebook for everyday school uniform guidelines.

Friday, May 26th will conclude our 2022-2023 school year. Traditionally we come together as a community and celebrate our children on the last day of school. Our cherished 8th graders and their beloved families are celebrating a culminating year and moving on. Meanwhile, our dear Kindergarteners are celebrating a year that has allowed them steadfast practice as a crew member within our Aspen Academy community. We celebrate their ability to uphold our values through their positive behaviors personally and academically. The day wraps up with a reunion for alums from every graduating class and a field day out on Curtis Field. This is an incredible opportunity for us to celebrate with all members of our community as we close the year academically. Witnessing the young hearts and eyes of our Kindergartners, alongside our 8th graders, sends an impactful visual message of the movement of precious time among all of our lives.





LiFE (Leadership, Finance, & Entrepreneurship)

LiFE is Aspen Academy's critical success factor. It assures that our students gain a sense of prominence in their leadership, finance, and entrepreneurial development. LiFE is a combination of our daily leadership curriculum, Bear's Student Enterprises (BSE), Student Mentor Program, Service Learning Projects, Entrepreneurs Expo, AMP'd and Shark Tank. All of these components are created to honor the inherent worth and infinite potential of every student.



Bear's Student Enterprises

Our capstone program is an opportunity for our 7th/8th grade students to operate a variety of businesses on campus, including the Bear's Store, Bear's Cafe and our broadcasting team hosts AMP'd.

Student Mentor Program

Each year, every student is provided the opportunity to be a mentor or mentee. Our 4th-8th grade students are often found reading, teaching, and sitting alongside their younger mentee students from grades Pre-K-3rd. The mentor/ mentee relationship extends the length of the school year. The pair will often attend school events, play games, and enjoy fun activities together while keeping in spirit with our commitment to leadership.

Service Learning Projects

Our students are taught skills and participate in activities that empower them to become engaged members of society. The Aspen Academy student body participates in over 7,000 hours of service-learning projects annually. All of our servicelearning projects are age-appropriate and relevant to each grade level.

Entrepreneurs Expo

A family favorite event at Aspen Academy is the Entrepreneurs Expo, when each grade exhibits the class business they created for the year. Problem solving and collaboration are fundamental skills that are showcased at the expo each spring.

Shark Tank

The culmination of our LiFE curriculum for 8th grade students is their business plan competition for "Shark Tank" where they pitch their business to local entrepreneurs in competition for a prize.

AMP'd

Every other Friday, our students participate in a student-led, school-wide performance called AMP'd. Every AMP'd is packed with comedy, talent, and amazing performances featuring two different grades at each show. You want to make time to attend AMP'd as often as possible!

Leaders Always and Everywhere Our on-campus Leadership classes are daily 30-minute

Our on-campus Leadership classes are daily 30-minute classes fueled by LiFE curriculum and revolve around a monthly practice to engage and inspire our students in their leadership of self, others and as global citizens.

In addition to personal finance, these are the themes we teach during leadership:

1. LEAD YOURSELF: You Matter. Live with purpose. You can do big things.

2. YOUR MIND IS YOUR SUPERPOWER: You can't change things outside of yourself, but you can change what's inside.

3. TIME IS YOUR MOST PRECIOUS RESOURCE: How will you spend it?

4. CHOOSE JOY: Be genuinely grateful in your interactions; happiness comes from within.

5. BETTER TOGETHER: Extraordinary things happen with the cooperation of many minds.

6. BE CURIOUS: Always ask what's possible.

7. THOUGHTS ARE THINGS: Everything starts with an idea; you give it life.

8. BE THE DIFFERENCE: Serve a cause greater than yourself.

9. LEAVE YOUR MARK: Always leave it better than you found it.

10. HAVE AN ADVENTURE: Play and rest are just as important as working hard.

ESSENTIALS AT ASPEN ACADEMY

It is clear that Aspen Academy believes in the whole child when you look at the school day schedule and see Essentials listed twice each day. The word Essentials is defined as: "a thing that is absolutely necessary," and that is exactly what is entwined into our core curriculum. Recognizing that Communications and Literacy, Math, Science and Social Studies can show up in Art, Dance, Drama, Fitness, Music, Spanish, STEAM, and more is why Aspen is a step above the rest.

I am an Essentials teacher and love teaching Dance at this school because there is so much more I can accomplish with a classroom of diverse genders, levels, efforts and needs that produce a richer ground for absorbing and growing all around. The leaders are not always the trained dancers, but many times we are led by the free movers and athletes. We start with everyone on the same page in our warm up and then I give them their tools to participate at their comfort level and they move on and thrive together. And since everyone participates, there is a safe space and energy that allows students to make incredible efforts. It is pure joy to see students present at the end of a three week session. Or the 8th grade graduation dance, which is a clear representation of incredible teamwork. Everyone dances.

I also love incorporating the core classes into our dance space. Our floor is numbered, providing safe space and formations. Students identify that they are using basic math when we travel six floor numbers to the right or left. If they are



studying a culture or country, we learn a dance that represents their new knowledge and inspiration. We use science for discovering force and energy and so much more in movement, and students will write and speak their thoughts over music.

The goal for a student in an Essentials class will vary in each category, but the general intention is that students step confidently into our classroom experiences and immerse themselves with interest, curiosity and progress. We are not expecting a student to become a musician, for example, but rather experience the benefits, skills and honor it takes to be one. Embody the skills and experience them deeply. **There is a familiarity when you travel from one Essential class to another: Learn and experience, relate and reflect, present and find pride.**

As a parent at Aspen, I see the confidence and joy that grows each time they return to the classroom. The idea of presenting their work with pride, and connecting an idea from one class to another so they never feel that this is something entirely new and never something they cannot achieve.

I truly believe that non academic core classes entwined in our core curriculum sets Aspen apart from all others. Check out AMP'd as another example of students who experience everything at Aspen Academy.
