# <u>Summary of the State Superintendents' position on the proposed changes to the</u> accountability system.

- 1. What the state board is trying to do:
- a. Move the cut scores on accountability rankings to make it more difficult for schools to earn top ratings.
- b. Change the calculation of the rankings to lower how student improvement or growth is factored in.
- 2. Accountability is important, and so are test scores but...
- a. This change moves the goalposts on schools yet again while the underlying data is no different. We hardly have a year go by without some change or shift like this in the goalposts or the tests themselves.
  - b. We know these ratings largely reflect the demographics of the communities where schools are located. This change puts even more pressure on the schools serving the most at-risk populations and makes it harder for them to reach the highest ratings in the state system.
- 3. The shift away from growth scores also fails to recognize that:
  - a. Students come into our schools with different starting points.
- b. Standardized test results are highly correlated with student demographics and poverty things that are outside the school's control. A fair accountability system should recognize the improvements schools make for students, wherever they start.
- 4. The larger issue.
- a. The world is changing dramatically due to automation, globalization of the economy, and easy access to information. Piling more consequences for schools based on a system that relies on
- fact/recall information goes against what the business community has been telling us for a decade in terms of the kinds of skills people need to succeed in the workforce such as communication, complex problem solving, adapting to changing conditions, and finding creative solutions.

  Standardized tests don't get a these concepts very well, but they are undeniably important.
- 5. What we want.
- a. We are asking the state board and the department to slow down and work with us to think through what a fairer system might look like, and one that recognizes and supports the kinds of shifts in learning that students really need to be prepared for their future.

The test scores measuring content are important, but they aren't enough and haven't been for some time.

# **About Esports**

## What is esports?

Esports officially stands for electronic sports, not to be confused with video games. Esports takes video gaming to another level with organized competitive gameplay between two teams, governed by its own strict set of rules and guidelines. The difference is comparable to a pick-up basketball game at a park versus a varsity high school basketball game. Esports requires teamwork, communication, critical and strategic thinking, creativity, sportsmanship, and leadership — much like traditional sports.



## What does the high school experience look like?

Like any other high school sport or extracurricular activity, your student will attend team meetings, practices, and official matches. However, since esports is played online, there is **no travel required** throughout the regular season. Players compete from their respective campus, supervised by a coach. Currently through PlayVS, students can compete in teams of five for League of Legends and SMITE, and teams of three for Rocket League, three of the most popular titles in esports. Each school year is divided into two regular seasons, Fall and Spring, each with their own playoff season.

# **Esports Safety**

### What are these games rated?

All games offered to high school students for competition purposes are either rated "T for Teen" -- games that are appropriate for students 13 years or older -- or "E for Everyone" -- games for all ages. Players must be 13 years or older to participate in the PlayVS high school leagues.



## Should I be worried that my student is playing too much?

The amount of screen time should always be discussed and monitored. Just as in traditional sports, student-athletes must find a balance between practice, games, school work, rest, proper nutrition, social time, and, of course, sleep. One of the benefits of joining a formal esports team is that rules and practice schedules can be set and monitored regarding how much students can play during the week and on weekends. Setting clear guidelines for device and computer-free times and zones in your home will help your student find a proper balance between all of their interests.

# AUTHORIZING THE USE OF A PORTION OF BEGINNING FUND BALANCE AS AUTHORIZED BY COLORADO STATUTES

WHEREAS, C.R.S. 22-44-105 states that a budget, duly adopted pursuant to this article, shall not provide for expenditures, interfund transfers, or reserves, in excess of available revenues and beginning fund balance.

WHEREAS, the Board of Education may authorize the use of a portion of the beginning fund balance in the budget, stating the amount to be used, the purpose for which the expenditure is needed, and the district's plan to ensure that the use of the beginning fund balance will not lead to an ongoing deficit.

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has determined the beginning fund balances in the fund is sufficient to allow for the one-time expenditures and the action will not lead to an ongoing deficit.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

IN ACCORDANCE with C.R.S. 22-44-105, the Board of Education authorizes the use of a portion of the FY 2019-2020 beginning fund balance for the following funds:

• Fund 10 General Operation Fund, in the amount of \$375,000 for the purchase of three school buses.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the use of this portion of the beginning fund balance for the purpose/s set forth above will not lead to ongoing deficits in the funds.

### **Guidelines for Public Meeting Conduct and Comment by Citizens**

The Strasburg School District 31J Board of Education values the input of citizens in making important decisions that affect the District's students and welcomes citizens to observe Board meetings and offer public comment.

To ensure citizens have an opportunity to offer public comment and to ensure that the Board can conduct the important business of the District, the Board will designate a portion of each regular meeting to hear public comment concerning matters within the Board's authority. Individuals shall not interfere with the ability of other citizens to observe the Board meeting or offer comment or otherwise interfere with the ability of the Board to conduct its business.

Generally, School Board Members do not respond to public comment during the meeting. The Board will listen to all comments and may direct the Superintendent to follow-up on an item for future discussion.

The following rules of conduct apply to all public comment:

- 1. Members of the public who intend to offer public comment to the Board shall sign up for comment with the Superintendent before the Board meeting begins. At the time of sign up, speakers shall identify the topic of their comment and whether or not they are a student. Speakers are expected to become familiar with and adhere to these Guidelines.
- 2. The Board President will set the order of speakers and shall call student speakers first. Only those speakers recognized by the Board President will be allowed to speak. Comments by others are out of order. The Board President may request a spokesperson for a group that shares common concerns.
- 3. Once called to comment, speakers shall come to the designated podium and state their full name, spelling their last name, home address, and reason for wishing to speak. Each speaker is allotted three minutes for public comment. Speakers may decline to comment when their name is called but may not yield their allotted time to other speakers.
- 4. Materials intended for consideration by the Board should be left with the secretary. No materials are to be distributed directly to Board members. Speakers may not use videos or slide presentations to accompany their comment.
- 5. Speakers shall not identify a student by name in open session without the permission of the student and the student's parent. Using a student's name without permission will result in the Board President terminating the speaker's remaining time for comment.
- 6. All speakers must treat each other and the Board and District staff with civility. Speakers are welcome to offer constructive criticism motivated by a sincere desire to improve the quality of the educational program or to equip the schools to do their tasks more effectively. The Board encourages citizens to exercise their free-speech rights in a responsible manner and to refrain from personal attacks against individuals, recognizing that defamatory comments may be subject to legal action.
- 7. The Board President may interrupt, warn or terminate a speaker's comments that are unrelated to the business of the school district, inappropriate for PK-12 students, or disruptive to an orderly, productive meeting. If disruptive, the citizen causing the disruption may be directed to leave the Board meeting.
