- Entries are double spaced evenly throughout the list
- The first line of each citation is not indented, but every other line is indented (hanging indentation)
- If you are handwriting your citation, you may underline titles instead of using italics

PRINT SOURCE EXAMPLES

BOOK

Structure: Author or editor's Last name, First name. *Title.* Publishing Company, Copyright date. **Example:** Strudiwck, Helen. *The Encyclopedia of Ancient Egypt.* Amber Books Ltd., 2006.

In-Text Citation: Author's last name and the page number(s) from which the guotation/paraphrase is taken must appear in the

text. Author's name may appear either in the sentence itself or in parentheses following the

quotation/paraphrase.

Examples: According to Helen Strudwick, Egyptian farmers began to domesticate the native African wild cat (136).

Egyptian farmers began to domesticate the native African wild cat (Strudwick 136).

BOOK (2 Authors)

The first given name appears in last name, first name format; subsequent author names appear in first name last name format.

Structure: Author's last name, first name and first name last name. Title. Publishing company, Copyright date.

Example: Malone, Michael P. and Richard B. Roeder. *Montana: A History of Two Centuries.* University of Washington Press,

1980.

In-Text Citation: (First Author's Last name and second author's last name Page #s)

Example: (Malone and Roeder 137-147)

Page on a website

Structure: Author or editor's name. "Title of Article". Name of website, date of resource creation (if available), URL. Date of

access

Example: Milman, Oliver. "The Quest to Find the World's Largest Bee." *Smithsonian Magazine*, 4 Apr. 2022,

https://www.smithsonianmag.com/ science-nature/the-quest-to-find-the-worlds-largest-bee-180979834/.

Accessed on 5 Apr. 2022.

In-Text Citation: rediscovery of the Wallace's giant bee, a rare slice of good wildlife-related news, was splashed

across media outlets around the world (Milman) (If no author then use article or website title)

YouTube:

Structure: Author, editor or compiler last name, first name. "Title of video." Name of Site, uploaded by (if available and

different from the author), date uploaded, URL. Date of Access.

Example: Hill. Raegan "The Power of Kindness" YouTube. Uploaded by TedxDeerfield, 16 May 2018,

https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=j8DkogKxXK0.

In-Text Citation: Use the first item that appears in the citation (author name, article name, Website name)

Example: According to Hill, being kind releases serotonin in our bodies (Hill).
