INSTRUCTION

Math Initiative

Providing an effective, consistent math experience for our students between grade levels and buildings is important. In order to move in this direction, teachers, administrators and math consultants met several times during the 2015-2016 school year to analyze the district's math curriculum for grades K-6. The committee spent time analyzing, reviewing and discussing several different math programs. This included making several visits to area schools to see the different programs in action. As a result, the committee has decided to pilot the Everyday Math program from McGraw Hill. Teachers will be trained in using this program and receive ongoing professional development at the building level by our new math coach, Mrs. Kristin Conroy.

Language Arts

R

Our district literacy goal is to prepare a generation of life-long, independent readers and writers. To achieve this goal, Boardman students are reading and writing daily in their classrooms using the Reading/Writing Workshop model, a research-based program that emphasizes the interaction between readers/writers and literature. Direct grade-level instruction takes place during a mini-lesson, followed by independent reading and active student writing. During independent reading time, the students are reading privately or with a partner while the teacher holds individual or group conferences with them providing feedback and discussing progress in reading and writing. Teachers also engage in guided reading groups of students working on comprehension and word skills. Although the program includes peer reading/sharing, as well as teacher conferences with students, it emphasizes students' independence and allows them to become successful readers and writers. Teachers have received professional development on the various components of this model and will be fully implementing these strategies in the 2016-2017 school year.

District Leadership Team

Boardman's District Leadership Team remains committed to the continuous improvement of our school district. Parents, teachers, administrators and central office staff met throughout the 2015-2016 school year to review district data, establish goals and identify strategies to achieve those goals. As a result of these discussions, our team decided to implement a Positive Behavior Interventions and Support program for the 2016-2017 school year. PBIS is a school wide systematic approach using evidence-based practices and data driven decisions which will continue to improve school climate and culture, increasing academic and social outcomes. Staff members will receive district and building level professional development to aid in the implementation of this program.







STAFFING

Food Service Report

This has been an exciting year for the Boardman Local Schools Food Service Department. Breakfast participation continues to increase, and students do seem to like the new breakfast menu implemented last year.

Some of the changes to the lunch program include Cocoa's Pizza & Pepperoni rolls, fresh fruit and fresh vegetables daily. Last Fall, we served fresh fruits and vegetables from local farms.

Student taste tests were held at Center and West Blvd. as part of a grant that Food Services received. Taste Tests are a great way to introduce new fruits and vegetables. Getting students to try new healthy foods was one of the goals of the Department this year.

Tot Chef Classes were introduced at West Blvd. and Stadium Drive Elementary. These after school classes taught students how to prepare various foods, from Cucumber Sandwiches to Smoothies. Students learned about kitchen safety, proper hand washing, and food prep. 30 students from each school participated in the Tot Chef Class.

Market Elementary received an Equipment Grant from the Ohio Department of Education. This \$5,000 grant purchased a 3-door freezer to replace an older one at Market.
