STUDENT SERVICES



We strive to meet the needs of our students, families and teaching staff to create a productive, safe and energized learning environment. Below are some district initiatives.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNERS (EL) PROGRAM

- Students whose native language is not English is the fastest growing student subgroup in Ohio
- Boardman is expanding its EL program
- Existing teaching positions have been converted to full time EL positions

GIFTED

- We are entering year two of providing Highly Qualified Professional Development to all of our teachers to better meet the needs of Gifted students in all general education classrooms
- Whole grade Gifted Testing occurs in grades 2 and 6

SAFE AND CARING ENVIRONMENT

- Expanding relationship with Alta Behavioral Health and Meridian Health to better service students and families dealing with social and emotional issues
- Using Federal money to expand our support services by 60 hours a week this coming school year

The Boardman School District continues to work to improve outcomes for students with disabilities. We received a perfect score of "36" on our Ohio Special Education Rating issued by the Office of Exceptional Children. "Meets Requirements" is the highest rating available and Boardman continues to meet this high standard of accountability.

Our District has been awarded a School Psychologist intern for the past 7 years through a fully funded ODE grant. For the first time this coming school year, we will receive *two School Psychologist interns*. This will provide added assistance with diagnostic testing and identification as well as some counseling for Boardman students.

CHILD FIND

The Boardman Local School District is required to locate all children who may have disabilities, ages birth through 21, who reside within its boundaries. Special Education services are available in our schools for any child identified with a disability ages 3-21. 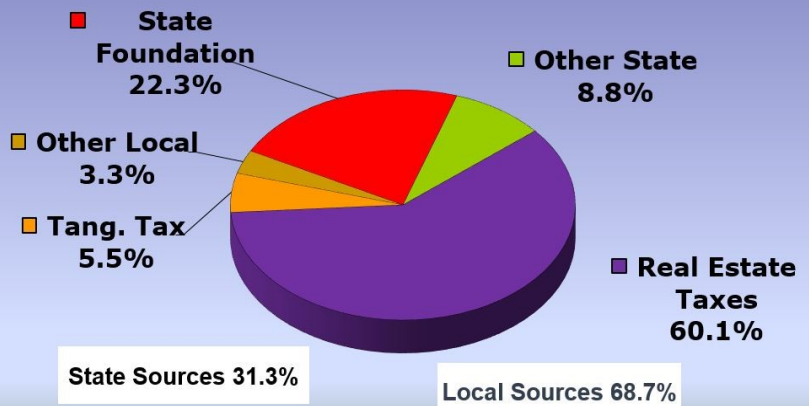
FINANCIAL ACCOUNTABILITY



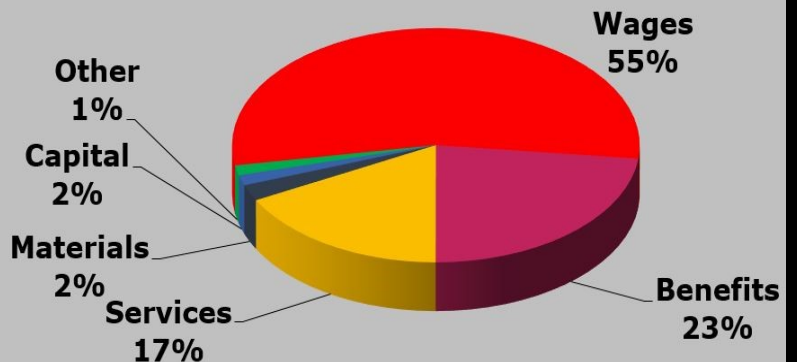
State Auditor Liaison Jim Shaw presented the State's Clean Audit Award to Boardman Schools Treasurer Nick Ciarniello on May 23. Shaw congratulated Boardman saying this award is not easy to achieve. Only 10% of the more than 6,000 state audits done each year receive a "Clean Audit Award."

This is Boardman's third consecutive award. In order to receive it, a school district must meet a number of factors including filing timely financial reports, and closely following ethics, public meeting and public records criteria.
