- January 2019: welcomed new Transportation Director— Ryan Dunn

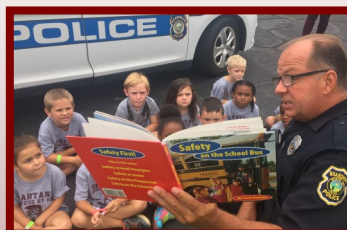

- Girl's Track Team earned AAC champion title 3rd year in a row

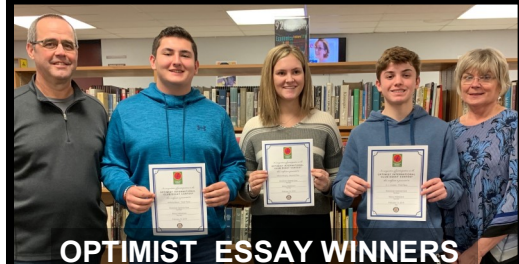

FINANCIAL ACCOUNTABILITY



This is Boardman's 4th consecutive Clean Audit Award from the State of Ohio.

Treasurer Nick Ciarniello and his staff work diligently to be accurate and timely with all financial reports, and follow strict ethical guidelines and public meeting requirements.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

THE DISTRICT SPENDS APPROXIMATELY \$600,000 PER YEAR FOR FACILITY IMPROVEMENTS AND SECURITY UPGRADES.

Since its inception in 2009, the BSFEE has donated more than \$60,000 to enrich existing programs and fund new projects in Boardman classrooms. These teacher mini grants encourage creativity, technology and 21st Century learning. Seven teacher projects were funded in 2019.

FOOD SERVICES

- 37 extremely hard working staff members provided 339,321 lunches and 71,782 breakfasts across the district - **HEALTHY, TASTY AND FUN** is our motto!
- Breakfast All Star Award from the Ohio Department of Education for Stadium Drive
- Tot Chef classes extended to all four elementary schools to encourage kids to recognize healthy choices and to prepare their own nutritious and delicious meals
- Food Service was awarded a \$10,000 equipment grant. The district will purchase a combi oven for this school year. It cooks items as if they were made in a fryer without the fat & calories (similar to an air fryer)
