Here are just a few of the many exciting things that we have planned for this year.

Indiana Career Explorer

In an attempt to help all students maximize their educational experiences at MSD of Boone Township and to help students succeed in their post-secondary endeavors (going to college, entering a trade/technical school or entering the workforce), Hebron Middle School and Hebron High School will be introducing all of their students to the Indiana Career Explorer throughout the 2015-16 school year.

Indiana Career Explorer helps students explore a world of postsecondary possibilities, make decisions regarding their future and prepares students for the next steps in their education and career planning journey. Middle and high school students will learn about their strengths and things that they like to do and matches these strengths and passions to five careers that reflect their strengths.

Furthermore, once these careers are identified, students could explore the details of each of these careers through interactive videos and review details such as the educational requirements needed to enter the field, future job projections and salary ranges when employed in the field.

The Career Explorer also helps students build an educational plan to meet their individual educational/career goals and provides a dashboard to let students know the progress they are making toward reaching their goals.

Olweus Bullying Prevention Program

On August 4th & 5th representatives from all areas within the district will be participating in the Olweus Bullying Prevention Program training and will serve as each buildings Bullying Prevention Committee. The Olweus Program is a research-based program that provides a long-term, district-wide approach to bullying prevention. The Olweus Bullying Prevention Program educates all stakeholders on the characteristics of bullying behavior, how to address bullying situations that do occur, and to create and maintain a long-term bullying prevention culture throughout the district.

Stakeholders include: administration, teachers, aides, counselors, transportation, school nurse, students and parents.

The program also includes the Olweus Bullying Survey that is administered to all students in grades 3 through 12 each year. The data gathered from this survey is used to assess the schools efforts in reducing bullying and helps each Bullying Prevention Committee identify areas within each school where improvement is needed. Once identified, the Bullying Prevention Committee is charged with defining strategies to reduce/eliminate the bullying behavior and to monitor the progress of their efforts over time. Elementary and Middle School Parking Lot Reconfiguration

During the past school year, multiple parents and school staff have expressed their concerns regarding unsafe conditions resulting in several near misses in the parking lots of the middle and elementary schools involving school buses and parent/high school student vehicles. These unsafe conditions place our students, parents and staff at risk for being injured. As a result, the District's Safety Committee elected to separate school buses from parent/high school student vehicle traffic in the middle and elementary school parking lots during student drop off and pickup times to enhance the safety for all students, parents and school employees. Beginning on the first day of school, school buses will only be dropping off and picking up students from the elementary parking lot (East lot). Electronic gates and concrete barriers will only allow school buses and school employees to enter the elementary parking lot during student drop off and pickup times. All buses will be entering and exiting the elementary lot through the southeast entrance of the elementary parking lot. Once outside the elementary lot, buses will be entering/exiting the school campus via the high school entrance on 231 and by using Utility Drive. No school buses will be allowed to go through the middle school parking lot.

Parents and others dropping off or picking up middle and elementary school students in their private vehicles will have a more efficient way of dropping off or picking up all of their elementary and middle school students at one location, Door D of the middle school, which is located in the middle school lot (West lot). Once inside Door D, elementary students will proceed down the ramp to the cafeteria or to the elementary gym. School staff will be outside in the middle school parking lot to help guide parents through the process during the transitional period. Parents will still be allowed to drop off and pick up their students on the north side of the middle school building as they have in the past!

ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE FOR LOWER-INCOME FAMILIES

Parents and students can obtain an application for free or reduced price meals at registration or on the schools website. You can check the income and household size chart below to see if you are eligible and if so, you are encouraged to apply.

Who can get free or reduced price meals?

- All children in households receiving benefits from SNAP (Food Stamps) or TANF, are eligible for free meals.
- Foster children that are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court are eligible for free meals.
- Children participating in their school's Head Start program are eligible for free meals.
- Children who meet the definition of homeless, runaway, or migrant are eligible for free meals.
- Children may receive free or reduced price meals if your household's income is within the limits on the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines. Your children may qualify for free or reduced price meals if your household income falls at or below the limits on this chart.

NO CHILD LEFT BEHIND NOTICE TO PARENTS

As a parent/guardian of a student in the MSD of Boone Township, you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the teachers who instruct your child. Federal law allows you to ask for certain information about your child's classroom teachers, and requires us to give you this information in a timely manner. Specifically, you have the right to ask for the following information about each of your child's classroom teachers:

- 1. Whether the Indiana Department of Education has licensed or qualified the teacher for the grades and subjects he or she teaches.
- 2. Whether the Indiana Department of Education has decided that the teacher can teach in a classroom without being licensed or qualified under state regulations because of special circumstances.
- 3. The teacher's college major; whether the teacher has any advanced degrees and, if so, the subject of the degrees.
- 4. Whether any teachers' aides or similar paraprofessionals provide services to your child and, if they do, their qualifications.

Important information from our nurse, Kris Hallberg For incoming 6th grade students in August 2015: 6th grade students this fall will need to have the following immunizations **BEFORE** the first day of school:

1 - Meningitis 1 - Tdap

2 - Varicella (chicken pox vaccine or history of disease) For incoming 12th grade students in August 2015:

12th grade students this fall will need to receive their NUMBER 2 Meningitis Vaccine **BEFORE** the start of school next August. Proof of the second Meningitis Vaccine is due the first day of school. It is recommended to get your appointments made early. Immunization appointments fill up quickly through the summer. It is not too early to get them taken care of now.



Hebron High School students were each issued a Chromebook computer at the beginning of the 2014-15 school year. The ability for students to have immediate access to resources on the internet is transforming education. Students are learning to do research, to evaluate the quality of information available, and to make use of software applications to process what they have learned. More than ever the high

school is a portal to the larger world, allowing students to explore and pursue their interests while meeting academic standards.

US News and World Report recognized Hebron High School as one of "America's Best High Schools." This ranking is based on the results of state proficiency tests with attention to the performance of students who are disadvantaged, as well as the performance of students enrolled in Advanced Placement Classes.

Under the direction of Karen Jania, American Legion Educator of the year, students have an opportunity to develop skills in visual arts in a variety of media. Hebron High School students displayed their talent around Northwest Indiana. Annabell Folsom was recognized at the Calumet college of Saint Joseph Art Show. Tyler Hill was a winner at both the South Shore Arts and Porter County Recycling Center competitions. Ashley Rumford's work was honored at the Pete Visclosky Congressional Art Competition and South Shore Arts show.

The Drama Club continues to grow in membership and in popularity, providing quality entertainment. The club presented Charlotte's Web for its fall play and The Music Man as the spring musical. Each production drew record crowds - over 1000 tickets were sold for the musical.

Prior to graduating, students at Hebron High School have the opportunity to earn college credit. Through agreements with Indiana University Bloomington, Purdue North Central, Ivy Tech and Vincennes, students can participate in concurrent enrollment classes. Over 40% of the students in the class of 2015 took advantage of this opportunity, averaging seven credits per student.
