Bishop John J. Snyder High School, founded in 2002, is a 4-year co-educational, college preparatory Catholic high school operating in the Diocese of St. Augustine. Our student body is comprised of 445 young men and women.

ACCREDITATION AND MEMBERSHIP

Bishop John J. Snyder High School is fully accredited by the Florida Catholic Conference and AdvancED (SACS/CASI). The school holds membership in the National Catholic Education Association, the Florida Catholic Conference and the Florida High School Athletic Association.

MISSION

The mission of Bishop John J. Snyder High School, a college preparatory school, is to assist in the formation of young men and women of competence, conscience and compassion; faithful to the Gospel and the teachings of the Catholic Church.

STUDENT LIFE

Bishop Snyder's student body represents a broad range of economic, ethnic, racial, and religious backgrounds. The school welcomes all levels of academic ability, from standard college preparatory coursework to honors and Advanced Placement. Students are encouraged to succeed at their highest capabilities. The curriculum and instruction prepare each graduate to matriculate to an institution of higher education.

FACULTY

There are 34 teaching professionals at Bishop John J. Snyder High School. Post-baccalaureate degrees are held by 60% of our faculty.

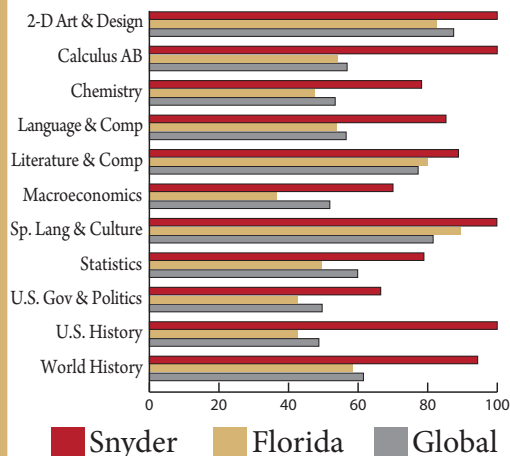
GRADE AND RANK INFORMATION

All students take seven credits each year. The cumulative grade point average (GPA) is updated at the end of each semester. Honors and AP courses receive additional weight. A comparison of the cumulative weighted GPA's of all students in each grade level determines class rank.

TOURS

HIGH SCHOOL PLACEMENT TEST

All eighth-graders must take the High School Placement Test which contains five multiple-choice sections: Verbal, Quantitative Skills, Reading, Mathematics and Language Skills. Pre-registration for the HSPT is \$25. The walk-up fee is \$45. To register, simply mail the registration form with payment to Bishop Snyder High School or visit www.bishopsnyder.org/admissions.

– APPLY & ENROLL –

DIOCESE OF ST. AUGUSTINE STUDENTS

Eighth-grade Catholic School students in the Diocese of St. Augustine may begin enrollment on February 21, 2023. Detailed online enrollment instructions will be sent to your home after the HSPT test.

NEW STUDENTS

Students from non-Diocesan private or public schools must complete the online application found on the main page of our website. There is a \$25 processing fee to apply. In addition to the completed application, we require the following documents:

- Copies of the student's 7th and 8th grade report cards
- Copy of current standardized test scores
- Florida Certificate of Immunization (form DH 680)
- Florida School Entry Health Form (form 3040)
- Recommendations from previous school
- Copy of the student's birth certificate
- Copy of the baptismal certificate (if Catholic)
- Current psychological documentation if applying to FOUNDATIONS

Student interviews will be scheduled after all items have been received by the Admissions Office. You may upload these documents via the online application.
