Welcome to the 2016-2017 School Year!

The MSD of Boone Township Board of School Trustees, the administration and the entire school staff would like to extend a warm welcome to the start of another exciting school year to all students and their families. We hope that the 2016-2017 school year provides every child throughout the district the best academic, athletic, social development and extra-curricular school experience ever!

Here are just a few of the many exciting things that we have planned for this year!

Expansion of our 1:1 Technology Program

MSD of Boone Township currently has a very successful 1:1 Technology Program that places Chromebook laptop computers into the hands of every high school student and most middle school students. The Chromebooks have proven to be very durable, reliable, appropriate for all of our educational needs and most importantly, affordable.

Thanks to the generous financial assistance of the Hebron Redevelopment Commission (HRC), through the use of Tax Increment Financing (TIF), the cost to purchase last year's seventh and eighth grade Chromebook's was partially covered, keeping the costs for expanding our technology program to a minimum for parents.

Currently, all students in grades 7 through 12 have a Chromebook computer and the sixth graders have been using the Dell Laptop Computers that were passed down from last year's eighth graders. All are included in the 1:1 Program. This state-of-the-art technology allows our Hebron High School and Middle School students to expand the boundaries of their classroom research to its highest level. In addition, putting this type of technology into the hands of our students prepares each student to effectively navigate complex hardware and software systems used for academic and research purposes, which they will be expected to know when they leave high school. With this being said, MSD of Boone Township is planning to expand the depth of its 1:1 program to include all fifth grade students. The Dell laptop computers currently used by the sixth grade students will be passed down to the fifth grade students in the fall of 2016 and we will be purchasing 100 new Chromebooks for all sixth grade students. To this end, all students in grades six through twelve will utilize the same Chromebook technology that will be used expand the boundaries of their educational experiences for academic and research purposes.

Indiana Career Explorer

Building on our goals to ensure that all students take full advantage of their educational experiences at MSD of Boone Township and to assist all students in defining, reaching and succeeding in their post-secondary endeavors (going to college, entering a trade/ technical school or entering the workforce), Hebron Middle School and Hebron High School will continue to expand the opportunities for all of their students to engage in the Indiana Career Explorer Program.

Indiana Career Explorer helps students explore a world of postsecondary possibilities, make decisions regarding their future and prepares students for the next steps in their educational and career planning journey. Through the use of the Indiana Career Explorer, middle and high school students will learn about their individual strengths and things that they like to do and will match these strengths and passions to five careers that reflect their individual strengths and talents.

Furthermore, once these careers are identified, students could explore the details of each of these careers through interactive videos and review detailed data specific to these career opportunities such as the educational requirements needed to enter that specific career field, future job employment projections/ trends and salary range projections for future employment in the specific career field.

The Career Explorer also helps students build an educational plan to meet their individual educational/career goals and provides a dashboard to let students know the progress they are making toward reaching their specific goals. The Indiana Career Explorer Program is flexible and grows with the student. As the student matures and their interests change, the interest based assessment could be retaken multiple times. The updated information will reflect the student's current interests and individual strengths.

Olweus Bullying Prevention Program

MSD of Boone Township understands that having a safe school environment is foundational to ensure that all students reach their highest academic and social development potential. Providing a positive school culture, one that accepts and respects the differences that we all bring to school every day, helps our students learn about other cultures and develop into well-rounded and mature adults.

The Olweus Bullying Prevention Program is a research-based program that provides a long-term, district-wide approach to bullying prevention. The Olweus Bullying Prevention Program focuses on educating all stakeholders on the characteristics of bullying behavior, how to address bullying situations that do occur, and to create and maintain a long-term bullying prevention culture throughout the district. Stakeholders include: administration, teachers, aides, counselors, transportation, school nurse, maintenance, students and parents.

The program also includes the Olweus Bullying Survey that is administered to all students in grades 3 through 12 each year. The data gathered from this survey is used to assess the schools efforts in reducing bullying and helps each Bullying Prevention Committee identify areas within each school where improvement is needed. Once identified, the Bullying Prevention Committee is charged with defining strategies to reduce/eliminate the bullying behavior and to monitor the progress of their efforts over time. NO CHILD LEFT BEHIND NOTICE TO PARENTS

As a parent/guardian of a student in the MSD of Boone Township, you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the teachers who instruct your child. Federal law allows you to ask for certain information about your child's classroom teachers, and requires us to give you this information in a timely manner. Specifically, you have the right to ask for the following information about each of your child's classroom teachers:

- 1. Whether the Indiana Department of Education has licensed or qualified the teacher for the grades and subjects he or she teaches.
- 2. Whether the Indiana Department of Education has decided that the teacher can teach in a classroom without being licensed or qualified under state regulations because of special circumstances.
- 3. The teacher's college major; whether the teacher has any advanced degrees and, if so, the subject of the degrees.
- 4. Whether any teachers' aides or similar paraprofessionals provide services to your child and, if they do, their qualifications.

Eighty-two graduates walked across the Hebron High school stage to receive their diplomas at the end of the 2015-16 school year. Their accomplishments are a tribute to their hard work as well as the support that they have received from the entire community. Over 35% of the graduates received an Academic and/or Technical Honors diploma, 55% earned college credit while still in high school, and over 30% of

the students were able to take vocational courses through the Porter County Career center while still attending classes at HHS. As they were being handed their diplomas, the students' plans for next year were announced. It was clear that the personalized education that they had received, prepared them to take advantage of a wide variety of experiences as they continue to college and careers.

As students walk down the halls of Hebron High School this fall, there will be a number of different names at the classroom doors, and more classrooms will be occupied. Based on the success of the referendum, the MSD of Boone Township was able to restore two lost teaching positions and one department. After examining the results of a student survey given in the fall, the high school administration recommended to the superintendent and school board that the Family and Consumer Science program be reinstated. This fall students will once again be able to take courses such as Nutrition and Wellness, Interpersonal Communications, and Child Development. Because some of the courses are recognized as training for workforce needs, the district gualifies for funding that will help offset the expense for the classes. We are excited to have Katelyn Mershon (see accompanying biographies) as our new FACS teacher.

Ms. Mershon will be joined by other new teachers, Doretta Kurzinski, Erin Charpentier, and Joe Villani, all members of the English department. They bring with them a variety of experience that will ensure that students will continue to receive the quality instruction for which the department has gained a reputation throughout the state. Lisa Beehn will be the new choir teacher for the high school. We welcome all of our new teachers to the school.

Student and parent feedback has played an increasingly important role at Hebron High School. The staff has solicited opinions through a variety of approaches, and the resulting information has been valuable. In addition to curriculum offerings, suggestions have helped us improve parent and student communication, instructional practices, and the daily class schedule.
