

Welcome to the 2017-2018 School Year!

The MSD of Boone Township Board of School Trustees, the administration and the entire school staff would like to extend a warm welcome to the start of another exciting school year to all students and their families. We hope that the 2017-2018 school year provides every child throughout the district the best academic, athletic, socially developmental and extra-curricular school experience ever!

Here are just a few of the many exciting things that we have planned for this year!

Expansion of our 1:1 Technology Program

MSD of Boone Township currently has a very successful 1:1 technology program that places Chromebook laptop computers into the hands of every high school student, middle school student and most elementary school students. The Chromebooks have proven to be very durable, reliable, appropriate for all of our educational needs and most importantly, affordable.

Thanks to the generous financial assistance of the Hebron Redevelopment Commission (HRC), through the use of Tax Increment Financing (TIF), the cost to purchase last year's fifth grade Chromebook's was partially covered, keeping the costs for expanding our technology program to a minimum.

All students in grades 5 through 12 will have a Chromebook computer, and the fourth graders will be using the Dell laptop computers that were passed down from last year's fifth graders. There will also be two computer storage/charging carts containing 30 new iPads each that will be used for students in grades K through 2. All are included in the 1:1 Program. This state-of-the-art technology allows our Hebron students to expand the boundaries of their classroom research to its highest level. In addition, putting this type of technology into the hands of our students prepares each student to effectively navigate complex hardware and software systems used for academic and research purposes, which they will be expected to know when they leave high school.

Indiana Career Explorer

Building on our goals to ensure that all students take full advantage of their educational experiences at MSD of Boone Township and to assist all students in defining, reaching and succeeding in their post-secondary endeavors (going to college, entering a trade/technical school or entering the workforce), Hebron Middle School and Hebron High School will continue to expand the opportunities for all of their students to engage in the Indiana Career Explorer Program.

Indiana Career Explorer helps students explore a world of postsecondary possibilities, make decisions regarding their future and prepare for the next steps in their educational and career planning journey. Through the use of the Indiana Career Explorer, middle and high school students will learn about their individual strengths and interests. The program will match these strengths and passions to five careers that reflect their individual strengths and talents.

Furthermore, once these careers are identified, students could explore the details of each of these careers through interactive videos and review detailed data specific to these career opportunities, such as the educational requirements needed to enter that specific career field, future job employment projections/trends and salary range projections for future employment in that career field.

The Career Explorer also helps students build an educational plan to meet their individual educational/career goals and provides a dashboard to let students know the progress they are making toward reaching their specific goals. The Indiana Career Explorer Program is flexible and grows with the student. As the student matures and their interests change, the interest based assessment could be retaken multiple times. The updated information will reflect the student's current interests and individual strengths.

Olweus Bullying Prevention Program

MSD of Boone Township understands that having a safe school environment is foundational to ensure that all students reach their highest academic and social development potential. Providing a positive school culture, one that accepts and respects the differences that we all bring to school every day, helps our students learn about other cultures and helps each of our students develop into well-rounded and mature adults.

The Olweus Bullying Prevention Program is a research-based program that provides a long-term, district-wide approach to bullying prevention. The Olweus Bullying Prevention Program focuses on educating all stakeholders on the characteristics of bullying behavior, how to address bullying situations that do occur, and to create and maintain a long-term bullying prevention culture throughout the district. Stakeholders include: administration, teachers, aides, counselors, transportation, school nurse, maintenance, students and parents.

The program also includes the Olweus Bullying Survey that is administered to all students in grades 3 through 12 each year. The data gathered from this survey is used to assess the school's efforts in reducing bullying and helps each Bullying Prevention Committee identify areas within each school where improvement is needed. Once identified, the Bullying Prevention Committee is charged with defining strategies to reduce/eliminate the bullying behavior and to monitor the progress of their efforts over time. Random Student Drug Testing at Hebron High School

MSD of Boone Township has a strong commitment to protect the health, safety, and well-being of all students and to provide a safe and secure educational environment.

Students experimenting with any drug or intoxicating substance pose a threat to their own health and safety, as well as to the safety of other students. The purpose of this random drug testing program is threefold: (1) to provide for the health and safety of students; (2) to undermine the effects of peer pressure by providing a legitimate reason for students to refuse to use any intoxicating substances; and (3) to encourage students who use intoxicating substances to participate in drug treatment programs with the support of their parents.

Beginning in the 2017-2018 school year, high school students involved in extra curricular activities or those who drive to and from school will be required to participate in this random drug testing program. It is further the purpose of this program to educate, help, and direct students away from drug and alcohol use and toward a healthy and drug free lifestyle. The program is designed to create a safe, drug free environment for students and assist them in getting help when needed.

Elementary School Office Relocation Project

As a proactive approach to enhance safety at Hebron Elementary School, construction crews began paving the way to relocate the elementary office to its new location at Door G. These safety improvements will require all guests conducting business in Hebron Elementary School to enter the secured vestibule at Door G, communicate with the office staff and have the door electronically activated to allow entry directly into the secured elementary office area to sign in. Once guests have signed in, the office staff will electronically activate the secured door allowing guests to enter the main building to conduct their business. Such safety measures have been put into place to add another layer of protection for all of our students and staff.

ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE FOR LOWER-INCOME FAMILIES

Parents and students can obtain an application for free or reduced price meals at registration or on the schools website. You can check the income and household size chart below to see if you are eligible and if so, you are encouraged to apply.

INCOME ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES* EFFECTIVE FROM JULY 1, 2017 – JUNE 30, 2018

Who can get free or reduced price meals?

- All children in households receiving benefits from SNAP (Food Stamps) or TANF, are eligible for free meals.
- Foster children that are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court are eligible for free meals.
- Children participating in their school's Head Start program are eligible for free meals.
- Children who meet the definition of homeless, runaway, or migrant are eligible for free meals.
- Children may receive free or reduced price meals if your household's income is within the limits on the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines. Your children may qualify for free or reduced price meals if your household income falls at or below the limits on this chart.

NO CHILD LEFT BEHIND NOTICE TO PARENTS

As a parent/guardian of a student in the MSD of Boone Township, you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the teachers who instruct your child. Federal law allows you to ask for certain information about your child's classroom teachers, and requires us to give you this information in a timely manner. Specifically, you have the right to ask for the following information about each of your child's classroom teachers:

1. Whether the Indiana Department of Education has licensed or qualified the teacher for the grades and subjects he or she teaches.
2. Whether the Indiana Department of Education has decided that the teacher can teach in a classroom without being licensed or qualified under state regulations because of special circumstances.
3. The teacher's college major; whether the teacher has any advanced degrees and, if so, the subject of the degrees.
4. Whether any teachers' aides or similar paraprofessionals provide services to your child and, if they do, their qualifications.


Ashley Shell – High School Guidance Counselor (Temporary)

Parents and visitors will experience a new way to enter the building this fall. For safety and security purposes, we are moving the Elementary Office by our front entrance (Door "G"). Visitors will need to come through the office before being allowed to proceed anywhere in the school. The office move has also necessitated us to reconfigure our 5th grade classrooms and our Resource and Title One rooms.

New Chromebooks are being purchased for our 5th grade students. Each classroom will have a charging cart to house the new computers. The school has entered into a three year lease with the Chromebooks which will have an impact on our textbook rental at that grade level. The Dell laptops used by the 5th grade last year will be passed down to enhance instruction for our 4th grade students and teachers. Two carts of 30 IPADS each have been purchased for student use in the K-2 classrooms. The Technology Department is also installing new projectors in each classroom for improved instructional delivery.

We would like to thank our outgoing P.T.G. President, Vanessa Brown, for doing a wonderful job of leading this important parent organization. The P.T.G. does so much to enhance opportunities for our students!

Online registration will be available to parents beginning on July 17th. Parents will need to login to Harmony to submit all required forms prior to the start of school. Computer labs will be available for parents to complete the required forms on this day.

Four years of 1:1

The graduating class of 2018 will be the first class from Hebron High School who have had personal computers for all four years of their high school career. It was in the fall of 2014 that all students were issued Chromebooks, and their educational experience was destined to differ from all students who had previously attended Hebron High School. For years, students

had been able to go into computer labs to be able to do research, but when teachers knew that every student had full-time access to computers, instruction could change. Through the use of Google Apps for Education, the computers became much more than just a research tool. Students could collaborate on their work in real time by sharing documents that each student could edit in real time. Teachers could give immediate feedback to students on their work. Teachers could communicate with their students individually or in groups knowing each would receive email through their device. Students could be notified through Google Classroom of assignments and upcoming events. Students can compete against each other using teacher-created games as they demonstrate mastery of basic knowledge. Each year, teachers are integrating different software programs that will enhance the level of engagement and enrich the experience for the students. The use of Chromebooks in the classroom is just one more way that the MSD of Boone Township fulfills its mission "to challenge and prepare students to succeed in a global society."

Important information from our nurse, Kris Hallberg: Changes for this year include the Hepatitis A vaccine for grades K-3. For incoming 6th grade students in August 2017:



6th grade students this fall will need to have the following immunizations **BEFORE** the first day of school:

- 1 - Meningitis 1 - Tdap
- 2 - Varicella (chicken pox vaccine or history of disease)

For incoming 12th grade students in August 2017:

12th grade students this fall will need to receive their NUMBER 2 Meningitis Vaccine **BEFORE** the start of school. Proof of the second Meningitis Vaccine is due the first day of school. It is recommended to get your appointments made early. Immunization appointments fill up quickly through the summer. It is not too early to get them taken care of now.
