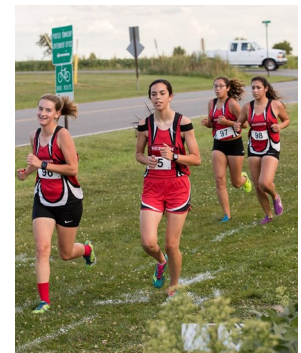
Boys Cross Country

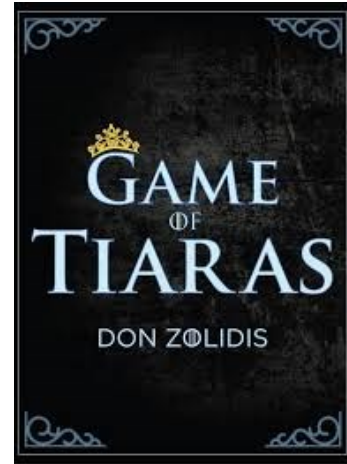
