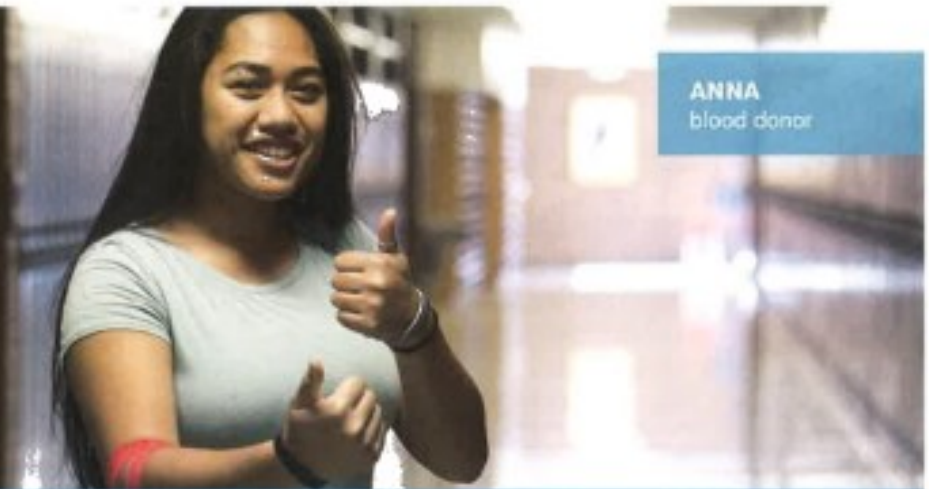
## Art Club
