We would like to extend a very special thank you to the community and student body of Hebron Schools who continually step up to help all those who are fighting cancer of all kinds.

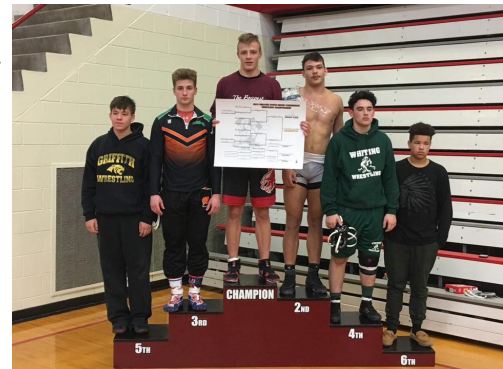

Student Art Competition

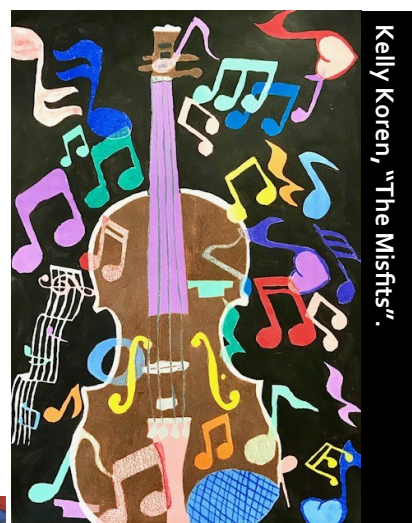

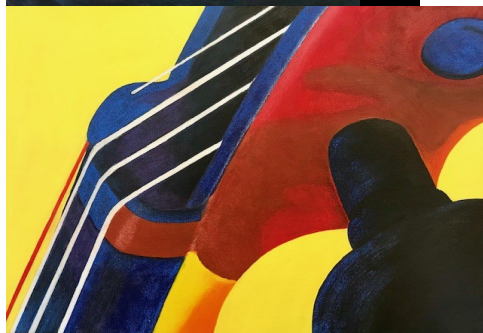

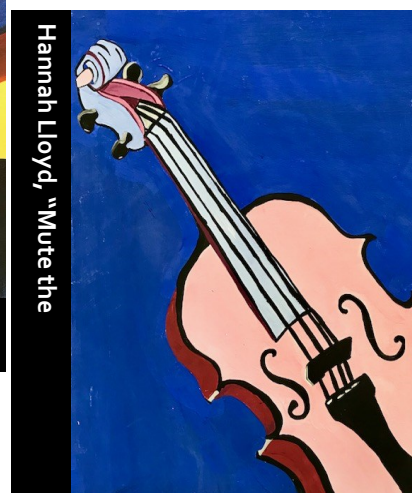

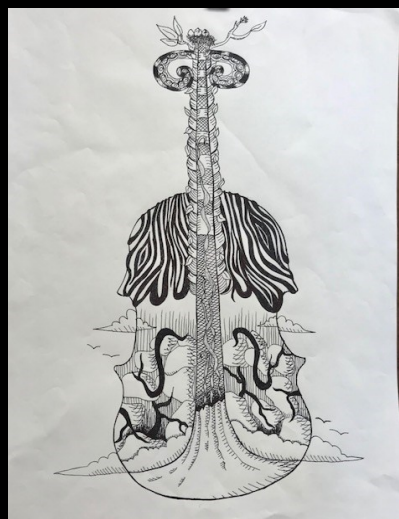

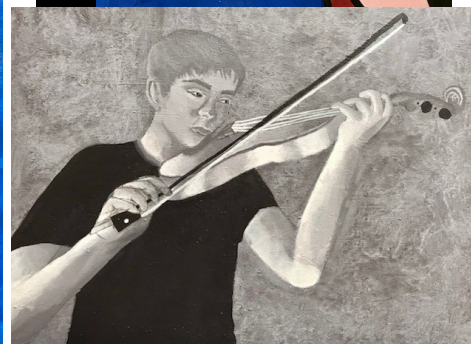

Tickets are \$10 for adults, \$7 for students, \$5 for children 5 and under and can be purchased at the door. Be sure not to miss this musical extravaganza!




