Art Students Recognized

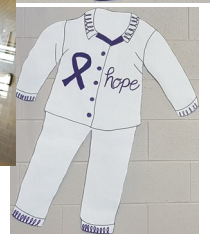
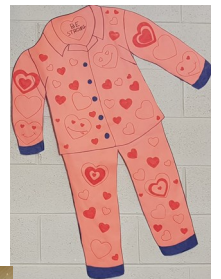
Congratulations to the following students who have been selected as Region winners of the International Violin Competition of Indianapolis:
