



## Superintendent's Message - Dr. Nathan Kleefisch



Welcome to the start of the 2018-2019 School Year!

The MSD of Boone Township Board of School Trustees and the administration would like to extend a warm welcome back to all of our students, parents and staff. We look forward to another exciting school vear!

Here are just a few of the many things that we have planned for this year!

### Middle School Office Improvement Project:

Last year, in an attempt to enhance safety at Hebron Elementary School, the elementary school office was relocated to an exterior location at Door G. All visitors and guests now enter the elementary school directly into a secured vestibule before being allowed into the office to sign in and conduct their business.

This summer, the same safety improvements have been made to the Hebron Middle School office. These changes will also require all visitors and guests to enter directly into a new secured vestibule, which is located next to Door A, on the northwest corner of the middle school. Once inside the secured vestibule, visitors/guests will be able to communicate with the office staff to have the door electronically activated to allow entry directly into the middle school office to sign in. Once guests have signed in and receive a Visitor's ID badge, they will be allowed into the school to conduct their business. Such safety measures have been put into place to add another layer of protection for all of our students and staff.

In addition to these safety improvements, enhancements at Doors A and B include new, wider sidewalks and landings that eliminate all outdoor stairs for a faster and safer evacuation pathway during a crisis situation when building occupants need to vacate the building quickly. Additional parking has also been added to accommodate our visitors and guests during their visits.

### Expanded School Resource Officer (SRO) coverage:

School safety remains one of our highest priorities. MSD of Boone Township in cooperation with the Hebron Police Department, established a School Resource Officer (SRO) program during the start of the 2017-2018 school year. Hebron Police Officers selected to be SRO's have to go through additional training and have to become certified as SRO's through the National Association of School Resource Officers (NASRO).

The goal of NASRO and SRO programs is to provide safe learning environments, provide valuable resources to school staff members, foster a positive relationship with students and develop strategies to resolve problems that affect our youth with the goal of protecting all children, so they can reach their fullest potential.

Last school year's SRO coverage consisted of two hours per student day. Beginning in August, our SRO coverage will be increased to eight hours a day, every day students are in school. This additional SRO coverage is in response to the increase of school related acts of violence throughout our nation. Funding through the Department of Homeland Security's Secured Schools Safety Grant is covering half of the costs for the SRO coverage.

### Change in Morning Arrival for Students:

In an attempt to enhance school safety at all of our buildings, only two doors in each building will be used for student entry during the morning arrival times. All doors in each school building will be secured (locked) throughout the day. This includes all exterior and interior doors. The schedule and location of which exterior doors will be accessible and supervised by staff during student arrival times are listed below. Anyone arriving outside of these times must check in at the main office of the school to gain entry into the building. School employees with valid FOB's may still use any electronic door for entry into the building.

### **High School:**

Door #1 (Office Door) will open at 7:25 a.m. on regular start days and at 7:45 a.m. on late start Wednesdays for all student drivers, walkers and those being dropped off by their parents.

Door #12 (Bus Door) will open at 7:25 a.m. on regular start days and at 7:45 a.m. on late start Wednesdays for all bus riders.

### Middle and Elementary Schools:

Door D will open at 7:30 a.m. on regular start days and at 7:50 a.m. on late start Wednesdays for all walkers, bike riders and those being dropped off by their parents.

Door G will open at 7:30 a.m. on regular start days and at 7:50 a.m. on late start Wednesdays for all middle school bus riders and at 8:10 a.m. on regular start days and at 8:20 a.m. on late start Wednesdays for all elementary school bus riders.

Students arriving after the start of the school day must check in at the office. No students are to be in the building after dismissal without a teacher, a coach or a sponsor.

### Expansion of our 1:1 Technology Program:

MSD of Boone Township currently has a very successful 1:1 Technology Program that places Chromebook laptop computers into the hands of every high school student, middle school student and elementary school student in 4th and 5th grades. The Chromebooks have proven to be very durable, reliable, and appropriate for all of our educational needs in addition to being affordable.

All students in grades 4 through 12 will have access to a Chromebook, and our 3rd graders will be using the Dell laptops that were previously used by 4th graders. Students in grades K through 2 are using iPads that are stored in charging carts and are available for use throughout the school day. All are included in the 1:1 program. This access to technology allows our Hebron students to expand the boundaries of their classrooms to their highest levels. In addition, putting this type of technology into the hands of our students prepares each student to effectively navigate complex hardware and software systems used for academic purposes which they will be expected to know when they leave high school.

### Indiana Career Explorer:

Building on our goals to ensure that all students take full advantage of their educational experiences at MSD of Boone Township and to assist all students in defining, reaching and succeeding in their post-secondary endeavors (going to college, entering a trade/technical school or entering the workforce), Hebron Middle School and Hebron High School will continue to expand the opportunities for all of their students to engage in the Indiana Career Explorer Program.

Indiana Career Explorer helps each student explore a world of postsecondary possibilities and prepares students to make decisions for the next steps in their educational and career planning journey.



Through the use of the Indiana Career Explorer, middle and high school students will learn about their individual strengths and interests, and then will find careers that match their passions and talents. Furthermore, once these careers are identified, students can explore the details of those careers through interactive videos and in-depth data specific to that field of employment such as the educational requirements, employment projections/trends, and salary range projections.

The Career Explorer also helps students build an educational plan to meet their individual educational/career goals and provides a dashboard to let students track their progress toward reaching those goals. The Indiana Career Explorer Program is flexible and grows with the student.

As the students mature and their interests change, students can reassess their strengths and interest. The updated information will allow them to revise their plans and goals for the future.

### **Olweus Bullying Prevention Program:**

MSD of Boone Township understands that having a safe school environment is foundational to all students reaching their highest academic and social development potential. Providing a positive school culture, one that accepts and respects the differences that we all bring to school every day, helps our students learn about other cultures and develop into well-rounded, mature adults.

The Olweus Bullying Prevention Program is a research-based program that provides a long-term, district-wide approach to bullying prevention. The Olweus Bullying Prevention Program focuses on educating all stakeholders on the characteristics of bullying behavior, how to address bullying situations that do occur, and how to create and maintain a longterm bullying prevention culture throughout the district. Stakeholders include: administration, teachers, aides, counselors, transportation, school nurse, maintenance, students and parents.

The program also includes the Olweus Bullying Survey that is administered to all students in grades 3 through 12 each year. The data gathered from this survey is used to assess the school's efforts in reducing bullying and helps the Bullying Prevention Committee identify areas within each school where improvement is needed. Once identified, the Bullying Prevention Committee is charged with defining strategies to reduce/eliminate bullying behavior and to monitor the progress of their efforts over time. ### Referendum

While we don't often talk about the positive impact that the referendum has on our school, I wanted to remind our community of all the great things that are being done with their tax dollars. At the start of the 2014-15 school year, and after several high school teachers had been let go, many students were spending a large portion of their school day in study halls due to the reductions of course offerings as a result having a smaller teaching staff. Since that time and after replacing the English teacher and the Family and Consumer Science teacher that were cut prior to the last referendum, students are flourishing with a variety of academic, career and technical course offerings to meet their educational goals.

In addition, expanded Career and Technical Education opportunities are available for all of our high school students who wish to attend classes at the career center in Valparaiso.

With the declining enrollment and the loss of state revenue, MSD of Boone Township is becoming more dependent on the referendum funding to maintain its high quality education programs.

#### Superintendent's Forum with the School Community:

In order to continue providing opportunities to enhance communication at all levels within our school community, we are currently planning for this year's Superintendent's Forum. The purpose of this gathering is to provide an informal setting for parents/guardians and the school community to learn more about all of the great things going on in our schools. The Forum also affords the school community an opportunity to ask questions and share their thoughts and concerns directly with the school administration. This is a great platform to share your ideas regarding our schools.

In October, information will be sent out inviting everyone to attend the Superintendent's Forum.

Congratulations to Hebron Elementary School, Hebron Middle School and Hebron High School for being awarded a renewed five-year AdvancED Accreditation! This accreditation process examines the whole institution, the programs, the cultural context and the community stakeholders, to determine how well the parts work together to meet the needs of learners. The visiting Review Team assesses

the quality of the learning environment to gain insights and target improvements in teaching and learning. AdvancED provides standards that are tailored for all education providers so that the benefits of accreditation are universal across the education community. We would like to thank parents, students, faculty and staff for helping us with this process.

We would like to take this opportunity to congratulate Elementary Art Teacher, Mrs. Mary Drazer, on her retirement from Hebron. Mrs. Drazer should be commended not only for her 30 years of service to Hebron Elementary School, but also for running an outstanding Art Program.

For school safety purposes, we will be limiting the number of entry points for students in the 2018-2019 school year. For students arriving by car, bicycle or walking, Door "D" will electronically unlock at 7:30 a.m. on regular start days and at 7:50 a.m. on late start Wednesdays. (Elementary students will not be allowed to enter the building prior to these times.) Door "G" will open at 8:10 a.m. on regular start days and 8:20 a.m. on late start Wednesdays for all students arriving by bus.

High stakes testing is not going away anytime soon even though the ISTEP Exam ended for students in grades K-8 last spring. The new ILEARN Assessment will begin during the 2018-2019 school year. These assessments will be computer adaptive, have reduced testing times, and a single testing window. After the first pilot year, the Department of Education is promising individual test results will be returned to schools within 12 days.

Online registration will be available to parents the week of July 16<sup>th</sup>. Parents will need to login to Harmony to submit all required forms prior to the start of school. (Book Rental will be payable at a later date.) For parents not able to register online, we will have one day (**August 6**) for **on-site registration**. Computer labs will be available for parents to complete the required forms on this day. Due to the number of families who no longer come into the building for registration, we will hold our Elementary Open House before school begins. The **Elementary Open House** will be held from 5:30-6:30 p.m. on Monday, August 13<sup>th</sup>. This allows for students and parents to find their classrooms and meet their teachers before the first day of school on Wednesday, August 15<sup>th</sup>. (Many parents also appreciated being able to bring in school supplies prior to the first day of school). See you soon!

### ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE FOR LOWER-INCOME FAMILIES

Parents and students can obtain an application for free or reduced price meals at registration or on the schools website. You can check the income and household size chart below to see if you are eligible and if so, you are encouraged to apply.

### Who can get free or reduced price meals?

- All children in households receiving benefits from SNAP(Food Stamps) or TANF, are eligible for free meals.
- Foster children that are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court are eligible for free meals.
- Children participating in their school's Head Start program are eligible for free meals.
- · Children who meet the definition of homeless, runaway, or migrant are eligible for free meals.
- Children may receive free or reduced price meals if your household's income is within the limits on the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines. Your children may qualify for free or reduced price meals if your household income falls at or below the limits on this chart.

### NO CHILD LEFT BEHIND NOTICE TO PARENTS

As a parent/guardian of a student in the MSD of Boone Township, you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the teachers who instruct your child. Federal law allows you to ask for certain information about your child's classroom teachers, and requires us to give you this information in a timely manner. Specifically, you have the right to ask for the following information about each of your child's classroom teachers:

- 1. Whether the Indiana Department of Education has licensed or gualified the teacher for the grades and subjects he or she teaches.
- 2. Whether the Indiana Department of Education has decided that the teacher can teach in a classroom without being licensed or gualified under state regulations because of special circumstances.
- 3. The teacher's college major; whether the teacher has any advanced degrees and, if so, the subject of the degrees.
- 4. Whether any teachers' aides or similar paraprofessionals provide services to your child and, if they do, their qualifications.



### **Porter County Health Dept. Information Children's Immunization Program**

This program provides childhood vaccines to children 0-18 years of age. We continue to offer vaccines to all children regardless of their insurance status.

### We vaccinate:

- Uninsured children

- Children insured by a publicly funded program (Medicaid, Hoosier Health Wise)
