All students must successfully meet NJDOE standards on the NJSLA or an approved alternative.

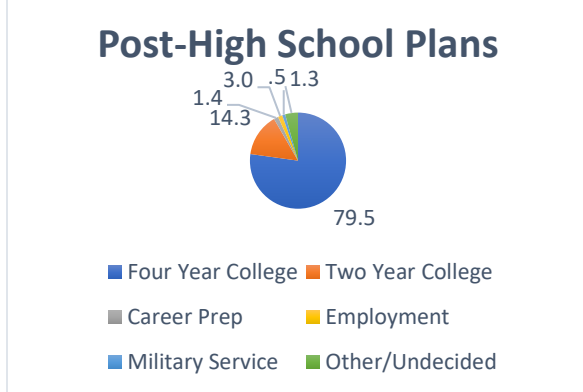
Class Rank

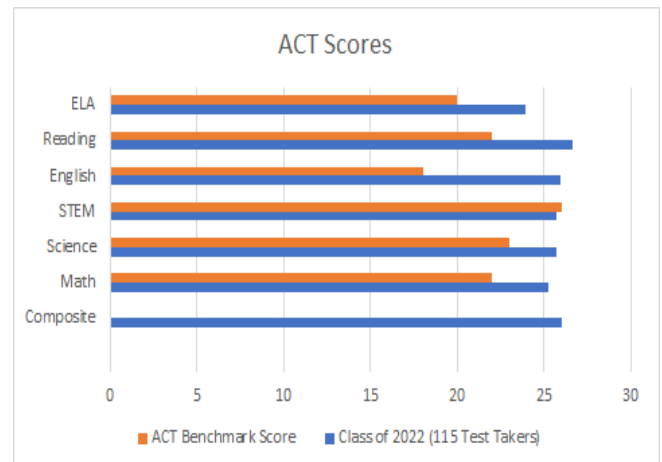
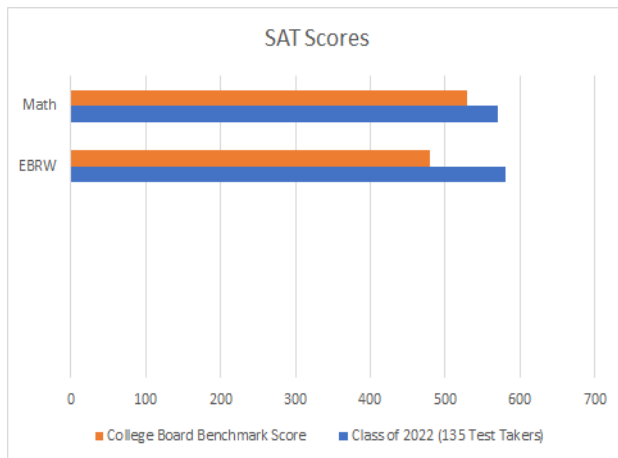
Advanced Placement Exams

Randolph High School is committed to the Advanced Placement Program. Our AP enrollment continues to be robust along with mean scores. We proudly became an AP Capstone school in the inaugural year of the program. Overall, Randolph High School has awarded over fifty AP Capstone Diplomas to date.

In May 2022, 382 Randolph High School students took 811 AP exams with 632 of the total scores three or higher. Total enrollment in 32 AP courses was 880 students.
