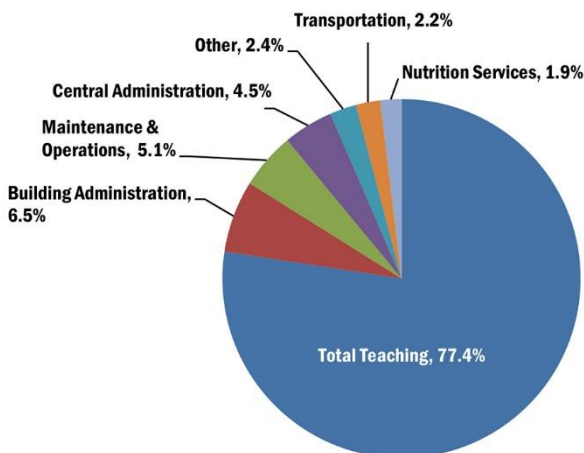
School Description

These skills are taught daily in classrooms and weekly in our Leadership Lab time school-wide.

2020-21 School Goals

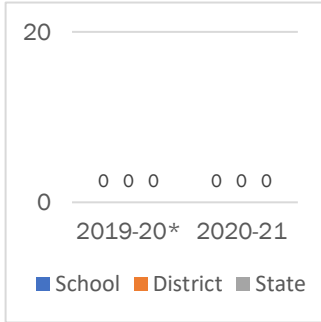
Teachers examined assessment data to determine school goals. Teachers met to discuss strategies to be used to increase performance in academic areas. Goals are monitored regularly.

- Grades K-2 Reading: 81% of students at standard on the end of year DIBELS
- Grades 3-5 English Language Arts: 80% at standard
- Grades 3-5 Math: 84% at standard
- Grade 5 Science: 85% at standard
- Achievement gap: 60% of students receiving English Language Learner services K-5 at standard
- School Effectiveness: 80% of staff members will respond positively to indicate their level of trust amongst staff.
- Attendance: By the end of the 2018-2019 school year, our goal will be to maintain or decrease our absenteeism rate of 2.7%.
- Discipline: Student referrals to the office during recess will decrease from an average of 11 weekly occurrences in October to less than 5 by May 2019.

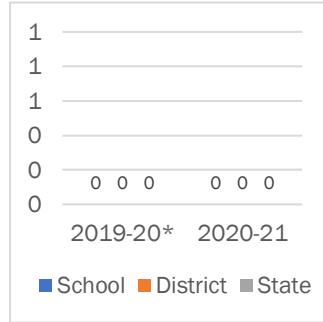

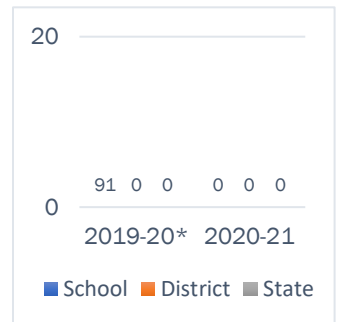
3rd Grade English Language Arts



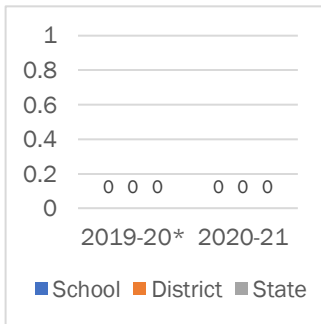
4th Grade English Language Arts



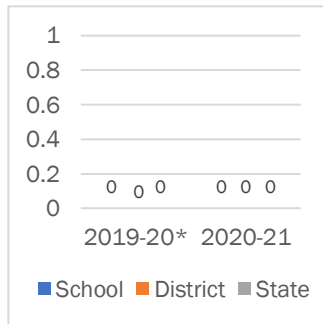
5th Grade English Language Arts



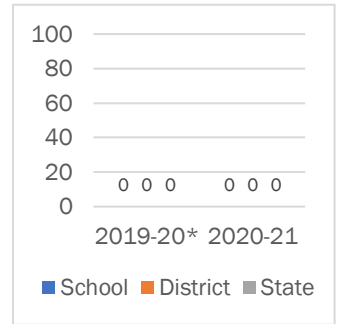
3rd Grade Math



4th Grade Math

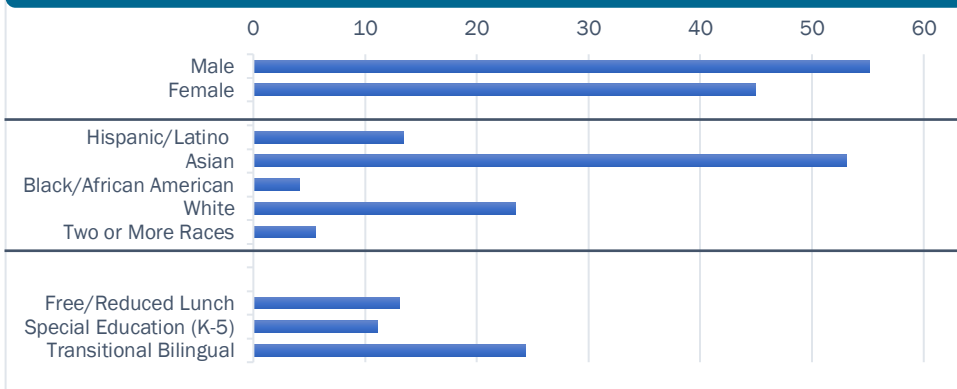


5th Grade Math
