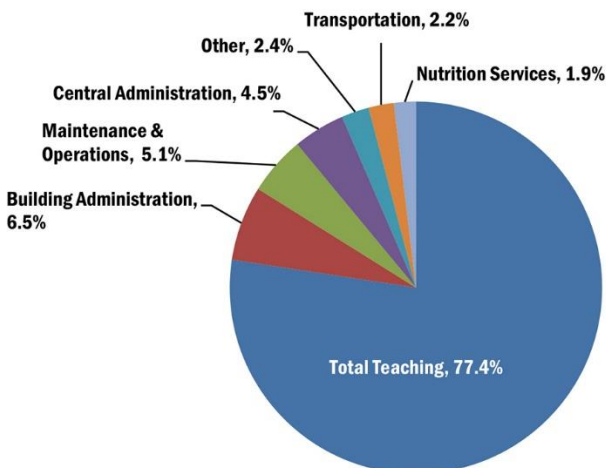
School Description

2020-21 School Goals

Math: Seventy-seven percent of Redmond Middle School’s 8th grade students (including 33% of those who qualify for ELL services) will meet or exceed standard as demonstrated on either the Fastbridge Math Assessment or the 2021 Math Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA).

All 6th grade students’ expository writing will achieve or exceed proficiency by their 8th grade year as demonstrated on the 2023 ELA SBA.

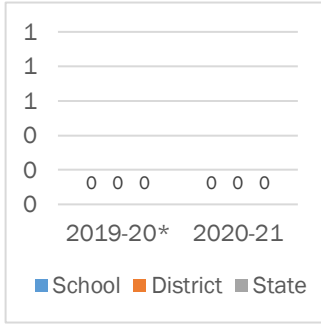
Utilizing a subset of questions asked on the 2020-21 Panorama Back to School Survey, RMS will see a 10% increase in the number of students who report that they are connected to adults, friends, and their learning at RMS from Fall 2020 to Spring 2021.

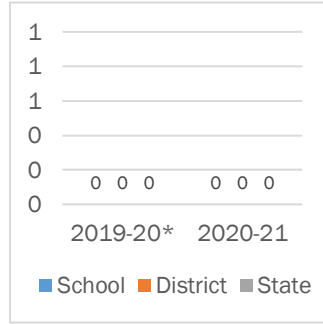

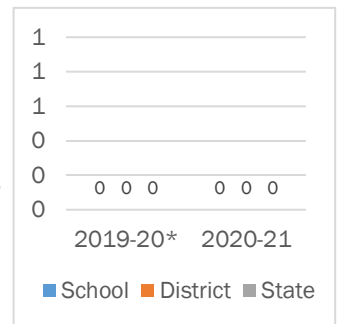
6th Grade English Language Arts



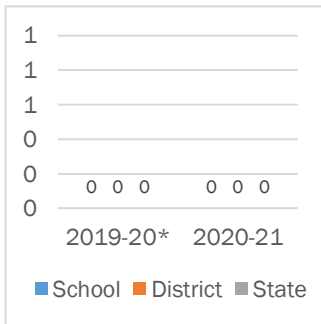
7th Grade English Language Arts



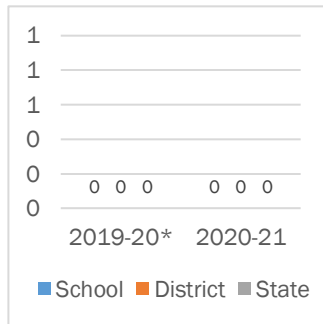
8th Grade English Language Arts



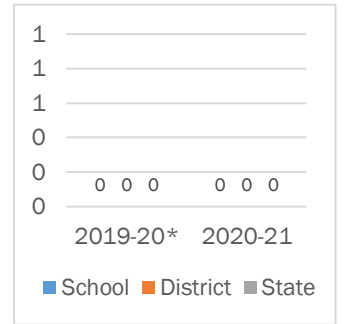
6th Grade Math



7th Grade Math

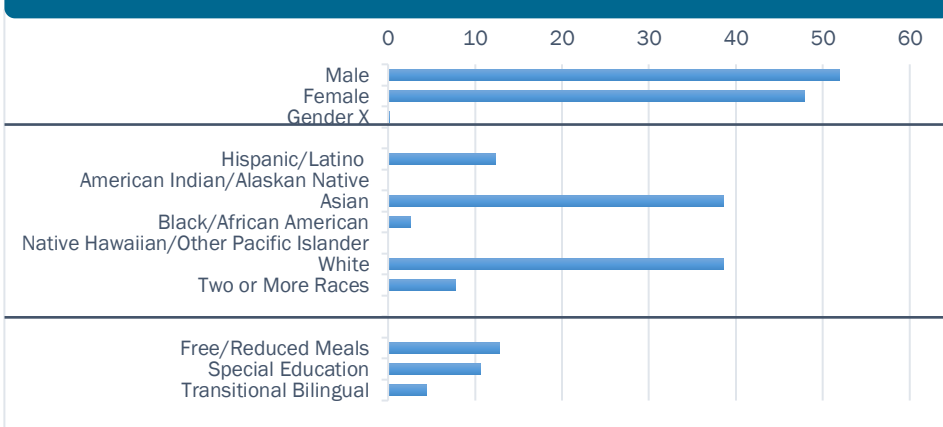


8th Grade Math
