

Superintendent's Message



Hebron Elementary School and Hebron Middle School have both undergone a renovation project this summer and fall to improve the schools infrastructure. The urgency to complete the remodeling project was due to the pipes leaking water


into the classrooms when the temperature dropped to below zero last winter. We had pipes break during December causing water damage to many classrooms. The old pipes and univents as well as the single pane windows letting in cold air all led to the demise of the system.

The funding for this project was financed through the federal stimulus project (Qualified School Construction Bonds) which allows a low interest rate during the amortization period of the loan. The school district was able, due to the low interest rate, to save approximately \$1,000,000.00 in interest for the \$3,900,000.00 bond issue.

The project included the following components:

- 1. Single pane windows replaced with insulated glass.
- 2. High efficiency boilers for both the Middle School and Elementary buildings.
- 3. New unit ventilators and DDC temperature controls in each classroom
- 4. Replace old chiller with a new high efficiency chiller.
- 5. Replace T-12 light fixtures with T-8 fixtures.
- 6. Install emergency generator.
- 7. New EIFS outer walls of elementary classrooms to replace windows which were removed.
- 8. Install acoustical pads in the cafeteria to reduce noise as well as painting the entire cafeteria.
- 9. Install new carpeting in the various hallways in the elementary building.
- 10. New cabinets along the entire length of the outside wall in each elementary classroom.




MSD of Boone Township Harmony Parent Access!




Hebron Students Earn College Credits while in High School

When Julie Huettner leaves for college next fall, she will be well ahead of many of her peers. Julie will have earned twelve college credits before she graduates from high school. Julie takes courses through Indiana University Northwest that will assist her in her pursuit of a degree in dental hygiene.

For over five years, Hebron High School students have been able to attend dual enrollment classes. These classes allow students to earn college credit and high school credit for work that they complete. The MSD of Boone Township has agreements with Indiana University and Purdue North Central for students to receive credit. In addition, students who take classes at Porter County Career Center may receive credit from lvy Tech or Vincennes University.

There were eighty students in the class of 2009. Out of this group, four students received college credit for English; nine students received college credit in statistics, pre-calculus or calculus; and nine students received college credit for their work in vocational classes.

Hebron High School is currently working to increase its range of dual enrollment course offerings. Conversations are being conducted with representatives from colleges and universities throughout the region to provide opportunities for students' advanced work at Hebron High School to be rewarded.









Middle School News

It is hard to believe that we have already completed the first nine weeks of school. It has been a busy, but productive beginning. The middle school staff and principal continue to work to ensure that each of our students receive a challenging and relevant education. We continue to meet every Tuesday morning in our professional learning communities to determine what has been learned and what needs to be taught differently so that students are learning. We also meet every Wednesday morning to write formative and quarterly assessments.

Every other Monday morning, our high abilities team is working to find ways to understand and meet the needs of our gifted, talented, high achieving, and high potential middle school students. The high ability team is determining the best quantitative and qualitative instruments to use to identify high ability students. We are also looking into high ability "best practices" to add to the curriculum and to the 5th hour structure.

Once a month the Response to Intervention (RtI) team, along with grade-level teams, meet to discuss individual students who are struggling and need intervention plans. The RtI team has been attending professional development opportunities that include helping the struggling reader, using effective vocabulary, creating fluent readers, using "hands-on" equations, and making Algebra child's play to help determine targeted interventions.

As part of our quest to provide a challenging and relevant education for ALL of our students, the middle school teachers attended the National Middle School conference on November 6th in Indianapolis. The middle school teachers were very excited about the opportunity to attend workshops and to hear over 10 nationally renowned speakers.

The sixth and seventh grade students have participated in a web quest on "Bullying." The eighth graders have participated in "Drive for your Life," also a web quest, to help students plan for four years of high school and beyond.

Each student will also put their name on a shoe to be taped in the hallways throughout the school. (Students will receive one shoe per each hour read.)


T-Shirt Award . . .

Professional Qualifications of Teachers No Child Left Behind Notice to Parents

As a parent/guardian of a student of the MSD Boone Twp., you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the teachers who instruct your child. Federal law allows you to ask for certain information about your child's classroom teachers, and requires us to give you this information in a timely manner. Specifically, you have the right to ask for the following information about each of your child's classroom teachers:

- Whether the Indiana Department of Education has licensed or qualified the teacher for the grades and/or subjects he or she teaches.
- The teacher's college major, whether the teacher has any advanced degrees and, if so, the subject of these degrees.
- Whether the Indiana Department of Education ruled that a teacher can teach in a classroom without being licensed or qualified under state regulation because of special circumstances.
- 4. Whether any teacher's aids provide services to your child and, if they do, their qualifications.
