### Policies & Procedures- READ CAREFULLY

ID Cards: Memorial High School students must wear and display IDs at all times when on school property.

Random Bag Searches: Random bag and person searches will be conducted 1-3 times per month.

<u>Closed Campus</u>: We are a closed campus. Students **cannot leave campus for any reason** unless a parent/guardian checks them out or they are enrolled in Tech or Concurrent Enrollment. Students leaving campus during the day will receive disciplinary action.

<u>Food Delivery Policy</u>: Students may not receive any food deliveries at any time during the day. Deliveries will be sent back to the restaurant. Any delivery driver on property will be asked to leave the campus. **Students ordering food will be subject to appropriate consequences.** 

Students Opening Doors for Other Students or Visitors: All visitors AND Students must enter through the main doors at the front of the school. Students caught opening any door for a visitor OR OTHER STUDENTS will be subject to disciplinary action.

<u>Parking Permits</u>: All student and staff drivers must register their car with Campus Police and receive a Memorial High School Parking Permit. Cars without permits are subject to fines and/or towing at owner's expense. Students must park in the designated student parking lot.

<u>Dress Code</u>: Students are **required to be in dress code at all times** when on school property. Students out of dress code will be required to change clothing or will be placed in TRAICE for the remainder of the day.

<u>Attendance</u>: Students are expected to attend all classes, every day. Skipping classes will result in appropriate consequences.

<u>Tardies:</u> Students will **receive consequences after their 5<sup>th</sup> tardy**. Consequences can include detention, student and parent conference, TRAICE and/or referral.

<u>Hall Sweeps</u>: **Regular hall sweeps** will be conducted each week. If students get caught in a hall sweep, they will receive a verbal warning the first time and detention each additional time (per semester).

<u>Lunchtime Procedures</u>: Students must eat lunch in the designated areas- large cafeteria, small cafeteria, or breezeway. Students **may not go beyond the gate** by the large gym **during their lunch period** unless they have a pass or sticker from a teacher. Students may not eat or hangout in any other area of the building but the approved areas. **Students may not leave campus during lunch or order food.** 

<u>Headphones/Ear buds</u>: Students must **only have one earbud in one of their ears** or one side of their headphones covering one of their ears before and after school, during passing periods and at lunchtime.

<u>Hall Passes</u>: Students are **not allowed in the hallway during class time without a pass**. Students in the hallway without a pass will receive appropriate consequences.

<u>Portable Speakers</u>: Portable speakers are not allowed to be played at any time during the day including lunchtime and in the hallways.

TRAICE: If a student is assigned TRAICE he or she will be **required** to do the following:

- Turn in cell phone to TRAICE teacher (phones will be returned at the end of 7<sup>th</sup> hour)
- Complete work in each subject in which they are enrolled
- Follow the rules in the TRAICE room or further action will be taken

<u>Tobacco/Vapes</u>: We have a "no tolerance" policy regarding the possession of or the use of tobacco or vapes and related paraphernalia. **Any student found in possession of or in use of tobacco or vapes and related paraphernalia will receive consequences** and TPS Campus Police or the Tulsa Police Department may be notified and a \$100.00 ABLE ticket may be issued.

<u>Alcohol and Illegal Substances</u>: We have a "no tolerance" policy regarding the possession or the use of alcohol or illegal substances and related paraphernalia. Any student **found in possession of or in use of alcohol or illegal substances will receive consequences** and TPS Campus Police or the Tulsa Police Department will be notified.

<u>Student Arrival</u>: School **doors will open at 8:00am** every morning. In case of inclement weather or if the temperature is below 40 degrees, doors will be opened at 7:45am. Students **arriving after 8:30am**, will need to get a **tardy slip** from Mrs. Rolland at the Attendance Desk.

Student Departure: All students must be out of the building by 3:45pm. Students will not be allowed in the building after 3:45pm unless they are with a teacher or coach.

### Memorial High School Dress Code

It is hoped that a minimum amount of time is spent on enforcement of dress code. It is the responsibility of the student and the parent/guardian to follow the dress code.

### "Armpits to Fingertips, No Skin Showing."

The school has the authority to decide the appropriateness of any clothing/accessory.

### **Dress Code Violations:**

Students out of dress code will be required to <u>change</u> clothing or will be placed in TRAICE for the remainder of the day and parent contact will be made.

- This includes hoods/hats worn on student's head.
- Zipping/Buttoning up a jacket is not considered "changing" clothes when wearing an inappropriate top.

Continued dress code violations will result in additional days of TRAICE and a parent/guardian meeting to complete a student success plan.

### Student Incentives and Fun

<u>Charger Cards</u>: Students making a 3.0 and above with no referrals each Quarter (October, January, March) will receive a Charger Card to wear on their lanyard, behind their ID. Students who earned a Pride Card will receive random rewards throughout the quarter like getting released for lunch early, sweet treats, food truck during lunch, etc. Charger Cards will be delivered each quarter to advisory classes. Students who earn a pride card during each Quarter (3 Pride Cards) will qualify for a "Super Pride Card" and will attend the end of year activity.

<u>Friyays!</u>: Students with no tardies or absences each week will be put in a weekly drawing and one lucky student will receive a \$10.00 cash award (students qualify weekly, so if you have a bad week, you can qualify for the next Friyay!).

<u>Student Activity Periods</u>: Student Activity Periods will begin Friday, October 14<sup>th</sup> and will continue monthly until May. Students will select an activity they are interested in and will report to the designated area or classroom for their activity. Activity examples include cooking, gardening, movie club, book club, indoor sports, knitting, etc.

<u>Perfect Attendance Activities</u>: Students with perfect attendance will be rewarded with activities in November, March, and May. Activities will include fieldtrips to The Zoo, Fun Zone, and school day activities.

MAP Growth Celebration: 9th and 10th grade students meeting their MAP Growth Goal will be honored at an assembly in January. Families of the students will be invited!

<u>Memorial Madness Week</u>: We are starting a new Memorial Tradition this year during basketball season called "The Final Four." It will be like our football homecoming but during basketball season. The week of February 6<sup>th</sup> – 10<sup>th</sup> will be known as Memorial Madness Week. Each day of the week there will be dress-up themed days. There will also be voting to nominate "The Final Four" on the Royal Court. The Final Four will be one student from each grade level that will be honored at the Pep Rally on Friday, February 10<sup>th</sup> and the basketball game on Saturday, February 11<sup>th</sup>. The Final Four winners will receive a custom Memorial Final Four jersey to wear.

<u>Freshmen Day</u>: Ninth grade students will receive a "Class of 2026" t-shirt and enjoy a field day and their 1<sup>st</sup> pep rally on Friday, September 9<sup>th</sup>.

Sophomore Day: Tenth grade students will purchase a "Class of 2025" t-shirt and enjoy a field day in April.

<u>Junior Day</u>: Eleventh grade students will purchase a "Class of 2024" t-shirt and enjoy a fieldtrip to The Zoo on Friday, October 14<sup>th</sup>.

<u>Senior Day</u>: Twelfth grade students will purchase a "Class of 2023" t-shirt and enjoy a fieldtrip to The Gathering Place on Friday, April 14<sup>th</sup>.
