FOOTBALL EARNS VICTORY OVER LOYOLA; BOYS SOCCER COMES BACK TO BEST MOTT

IRISH COME BACK TO EARN VICTORY OVER MOTT

The Notre Dame Boys Varsity Soccer team earned a 2-1, comeback win over Waterford Mott. Following a scoreless first half, the Corsairs got on the board first in the 50th minute. After a Mott error, the Lanham brothers devised a set piece play for the equalizer from seven yards, out with Will providing the assist to Jake. In the 72nd minute, Edziu Lis drew a foul (and soon to be assist) in the box. Nico Liparoto put the ball in the back of the net on the penalty kick, giving the Irish the lead. Notre Dame held on from there, led by strong midfield and defensive play.

BOYS TENNIS PLACES SECOND AT ARMADA QUAD

The Notre Dame Boys Varsity Tennis team placed second at the Armada Quad over the weekend. The Irish earned 14 team points, finishing only behind host Armada, who had 18. Max Thornton and Ben Valade (first doubles) and Jacob Evans and Marc Farah (fourth doubles) both earned first place finishes in their flights. Ryan Wells took second at fourth singles, George Moussa and Beck Silver were second at second doubles, and Nolan Tompkins and Paolo Fregoli were second at third doubles to score valuable points for Notre Dame.

FOOTBALL GETS ROAD WIN OVER LOYOLA

The Notre Dame Varsity Football team moved to 3-1 on the season with a 34-20 win over Detroit Loyola. The Irish took a 21-6 lead into halftime courtesy of three touchdown passes by Jacob Tuttle. Tuttle found Matthew Sadecki for a eight yard touchdown in the opening quarter and tossed touchdown passes to Evan Gaeschke (13 yards) and Jeremy Gale (24 yards) in the second quarter. The Bulldogs would draw within 21-14 heading into the fourth, but the Irish would quickly restore the lead to two scores on a Zach Mylenek five yard run just seconds into the final quarter. Loyola would once again answer to make it a one-score game and would move the ball deep into Irish territory, but Caden Husch would record a goal line interception to keep Notre Dame ahead. The Irish would run down the game clock Mylenek would add his second score of the game, this time from 40 yards out to seal the victory. Tuttle finished with 240 yards through the air and 73 on the ground. Mylenek carried 22 times for 149 yards while also adding seven receptions for 81 yards Gale led all Irish receivers with 100 yards on six receptions. Defensively, Sadecki finished with nine tackles while Drew Heimbuch had eight solo tackles and two sacks. Gaeschke and Nathan Bloom also recorded sacks, Husch and Joey DeCasas had interceptions and Bradon Prater (six tackles) and Billy Collins (five) also had strong performances.

GIRLS SWIM GETS WIN OVER OXFORD

The Notre Dame Girls Varsity Swim team earned a 104-79 win over Oxford. First into the wall and scoring points were the team of Tori Devine, Emma Ciesla, Aria Kim and Alex Williams in the 200 Medley Relay. Point makers in the 200 Free were winner Grace Linenfelser, Olivia Powell in third, and Mia Skandalaris in fourth place. In the 200 IM, the Irish saw a first, second and third place finish from Ciesla, Williams, and Kim. Rita Hajjar, and Devine took first and second, while Mariana Spada took fifth place in the 50 Free. Diving results showed Allison Voto in fourth place while Kiersten Alexander dove exhibition. The second half of the meet mirrored the first half with a solid second, third and sixth place finished in the 100 Fly by Linenfelser, Spada and Cat Zaleski. Ciesla secured her sixth state cut in the 500 Free while second place went to Lauren Chojnacki, and fifth place went to Grace Simon. Notre Dame dominated the 200 Free relay with a six second win from the team of Powell, Linenfelser, Hajjar, and Williams. Third place point makers were the team of Devine, Spada, Hunter, and Skandalaris. In the 100 Backstroke, Powell, Kim and Skandalaris took third, fourth and sixth. The last individual event of the evening was the 100 Breaststroke, where Chojnacki, Hunter, and Ella Kissman took second, fourth and sixth place. The meet wrapped up with Notre Dame leading the way in the 400 Free Relay, with Powell, Hajjar, Linenfelser and Ciesla taking first and Mia Palizzi, Zaleski, Skandalaris, and Chojnacki taking third.

IRISH GO UNBEATEN TO TAKE IMLAY CITY TITLE

A shorthanded Notre Dame Varsity Volleyball team used a balanced attack to improve to 25-6-2 by going 4-0-1 at the Imlay City tournament. This marked the first tournament title of the season for the Irish. Notre Dame began the day with a match against Cass City. The Irish took a big lead (20-14) in the opening set, but Cass City fought back to take the set 25-22. Notre Dame rebounded in the second set to earn a split 25-14. Madison Pawlowski and Mya Kattula led the Irish attack with five and four kills, respectively. Kattula added eight service points, three blocks, three digs and four assists. Aly Berent was strong at the service line collecting three aces on her way to six points and 19 serve receptions. Delaney Zielke added three blocks. Notre Dame then earned a 25-12, 25-10 win over Armada. Bree Blakeslee had nine points and Kattula had eight kills three blocks, three aces and seven assists. Margo Sudzina collected 13 assists, Pawlowski had six kills, Zielke had five kills and two blocks and Berent had five points and 10 more serve receptions. In the final match of pool play Notre Dame defeated Lapeer 25-10, 25-16 behind 10 aces. Berent had eight points and 16 serve receptions and Kattula had seven kills and five assists. Sudzina added five assists for the Irish, who earned an opening round bye in bracket play. In the semifinal, the Irish defeated Lutheran North 25-

23, 25-19. Kattula once again led

the offense with seven kills and six

assists while Zielke added six kills

blocks. Sudzina handed out 14 assists and had 10 service point while Berent and Sophia Sermo each had 12 serve receptions. The Irish took on Cass City for a second time in the final and came away with a 25-20, 25-13 win. Sudzina set the pace with seven service points, a pair of aces and 15 assists. Kattula added nine assists and six kills while Pawlowski had six kills. Blakeslee had five kills and serve receptions, Zielke had five kills and three blocks, Audrey Thummel scored four times from the serving line, including an ace and came up with four digs and Berent contributed nine serve receptions and four digs.

NOTRE DAME TAKES SIXTH AT STONEYCROFT INVITE

The Notre Dame Girls Varsity Golf team placed sixth at the Stoneycroft Hills Tournament, finishing with a team score of 403. The Notre Dame Girls Varsity Golf team placed eighth out of 17 teams at the Dick's Sporting Goods Invitational held at Glenbriar Golf Course, finishing with a team score of 423. Amanda Roth led the Irish with a 101 with Brooklyn Haddad (105), Ashley Larimer (106) and Emily Szalach (111) also factoring into the scoring effort for Notre Dame.

XC COMPETES AT ANNUAL HOLLY FESTIVAL OF RACES

The Notre Dame Boys and Girls Cross Country teams competed at the highly competitive Holly Duane Raffin Festival of Races on Saturday, placing 11th and eighth overall. In what is becoming a regular occurrence, senior and team captain Ben Kincade earned a medal and made a trip to the award stand by placing 21st overall. Medals were awarded to the top 35 athletes in each race. Isaac Brook, Chris Hunter, Ryan Wojichowski, John Milback, Nick Mardelli, and Christian Estrellas also ran varsity, with Brook, Hunter, Milback, Mardelli and Estrellas all setting season bests on the tough Springfield Oaks County Park course. Mardelli also set a personal record by :12 in the race. Jack Leuchtmann, Gavin Hullinger, and Oliver Kugler all set personal records in the JV race. The girls team was led by Skylar Vanhecke who continued her strong season with another medal performance finishing 31st overall. Mary Larocca, Sydney Schulte, Addie Mikel, Addie Bellows, and team captain Jillian Essig rounded out the varsity roster. Larocca, Schulte, and Mikel all set personal records while Bellows and Essig set season bests. Nicole Spengler earned a medal with a 29th place finish in the JV race, which featured 11 athletes setting season or personal best records. Notre Dame will travel to Springfield, Ohio next to compete in an overnight meet at the Midwest Catholic Championship that includes Catholic Schools from Michigan, Ohio, and Kentucky.
