We have had a very unique start to our school year. On August 14th, the Caldor Fire erupted and displaced 50 of our students and 8 of our staff members. They were evacuated from their homes and moved in with family and friends for three full weeks. The CMP Community came together and donations started pouring in from our Shingle Springs families, our five sister CMP campuses, the Central Office Team, Board Members, and local companies. Everyone has been extremely generous with their donations and contributions, which enabled us to provide our evacuated students with breakfast and lunch each day. In addition, clothing, toiletries, food, water and gift cards to local stores kept pouring in and families were able to come to the school to pick up necessities. Our evacuated families and staff have been overwhelmed by the generosity and support of our greater CMP Community. We have distributed over \$2,500 in gift cards, along with the basic necessities families needed during this trying time. It was quite amazing to watch several of our evacuated students help out with distributions at these pick-up events. They felt so touched by the experience that they wanted to help as well!
