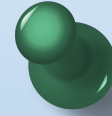
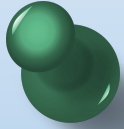

- should end the year with at least 230 credits in the appropriate subject areas to meet the High School graduation requirements.

*If student receives a **D or F** in an A-G course, it must be retaken for grade improvement to earn a **C or higher**

*If student receives an **F** in a core graduation requirement, it must be retaken to meet High School graduation requirements

How do I apply for an ROP class?

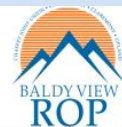
- You can register with Ms. Garza in the Career Center or email liliana_garza@upland.k12.ca.us for the Spring Session.

Can I enroll in more than one course?

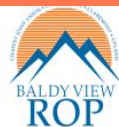
- Yes, you can enroll in multiple courses as long as the class schedules do not conflict.

Can I receive College credit?

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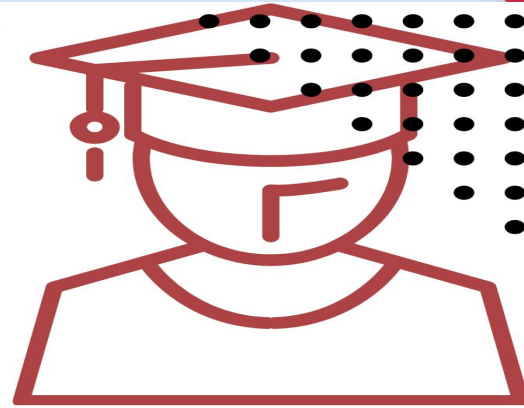
Dual Enrollment

With the PSAT you can:

- Get ready for the SAT.
- Eligible Juniors will be automatically entered into scholarship and recognition competitions. These competitions include the prestigious National Merit Scholarship Program.
- Access personalized college and career planning resources and get AP® potential feedback in My College QuickStart™ and personalized study programs through Khan Academy.
- Request information from colleges and universities.
- Assess your critical reading, mathematical reasoning and writing skills.
- Get suggestions on how to improve your academic skills.

SAT/ACT Testing

SAT: **Collegeboard.org**
ACT: **act.org**

- UC/CSU and junior/community colleges in California **will not use either test for admission** for students admitted to the 2022/2023 School Year.
- Private and out of state colleges may use the test (**it is up to you as a student to check the admission requirements for any college you apply to**).
- NCAA **will not be requiring** student athletes to take the SAT/ACT for Division I, II, and III schools.

College Deadlines

California Public Universities

University of California(UC): minimum 3.0 academic gpa and completion of A-G requirements, **October 1st thru November 30th**

California State University(CSU): minimum 2.50 academic gpa and completion of A-G requirements, **October 1st thru November 30th**



Private and Out-of-State Colleges

Deadlines will vary based on the college. It is up to you as a student to check the admission deadlines for these type of schools.

Some private schools give you two other options when you apply:

1. **Early decision** plans are **binding** — a student who is accepted as an early decision applicant must attend the college.
2. **Early action** plans are **non-binding** — students receive an early response to their application, but do not have to commit to the college until the normal reply date of May 1

College Application Info & Workshops

- **College Application workshops:**
- Starting October 7th through November 30th we will be holding application workshops in the Counseling Classroom (C108) to help students with their college applications
- **Letters of Recommendations:**
- Not needed for UC or CSU, Junior colleges, but please check private colleges and/or out of state colleges for requirements
- Best letters are from people who can speak to the students academic performance
- **If counselor letter of recommendation is specifically required, students must complete and submit letter of recommendation request packet (located in your counselors google classroom). Deadline is 10/1/22 11:59pm.**

Call 1-888-CA-GRANT with questions.
The Cal Grant filing deadline is March 2.

WHAT YOU WILL NEED:

- Driver's license, if you have one
- Social Security Card, if you have one
- Alien registration number, if you have one
- Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN) – if you have one
