#### System Support


Supports the efforts of teachers, staff, parents, and community members in promoting the educational, career, personal, and social development of students

School Counselors are available to assist students with a wide range of personal concerns, including such areas as social, family, emotional, mental health, or substance abuse. A student may request to visit the school counselor's office and parents may request resources from a counselor. In order to meet the personal needs of students, school counselors may also offer support groups on a recurring basis. If a parent/guardian does not want their student to participate in a support group, written documentation of denial of services will need to be provided to the school counselor.

Click the name of the counselor you are requesting to see and complete the form.
